AN ACT

- Designating a portion of State Route 2025, also known as Morton 1 Avenue, between Pennsylvania Route 420, also known as 2 Woodland Avenue, in Morton Borough and Linden Avenue in 3 Rutledge Borough, Delaware County, as the Captain Daniel Clement Memorial Highway. 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: 7
- Section 1. Captain Daniel Clement Memorial Highway. 8
- (a) Findings. -- The General Assembly finds and declares as
- follows: 10
- 11 Daniel Clement was born September 8, 1987. (1)
- 12 Captain Clement served as an airman in the United
- 13 States Air Force.
- 14 Captain Clement also served as a police officer at
- 15 Temple University, an emergency medical technician at
- 16 Swarthmore and as a volunteer firefighter.
- Captain Clement started his volunteer firefighter 17
- career with the Rutledge Fire Company in Delaware County. 18

- 1 (5) Captain Clement continued serving with Rutledge Fire
- 2 Company and was appointed captain after the merger that
- 3 created the Morton-Rutledge Fire Company.
- 4 (6) Captain Daniel Clement passed away September 3,
- 5 2021, at the age of 33.
- 6 (b) Designation. -- The portion of State Route 2025, also
- 7 known as Morton Avenue, between Pennsylvania Route 420, also
- 8 known as Woodland Avenue, in Morton Borough and Linden Avenue in
- 9 Rutledge Borough, Delaware County, is designated the Captain
- 10 Daniel Clement Memorial Highway.
- 11 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 12 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to
- 13 traffic in both directions on the highway.
- 14 Section 2. Effective date.
- This act shall take effect in 60 days.
