## AN ACT

Establishing the COVID-19 Child Care Grant Program and the 1 COVID-19 Child Care Fund; providing for duties of the 2 Department of Community and Economic Development; and making 3 an appropriation. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 6 7 Section 1. Short title. 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the COVID-19 9 Child Care Grant Program Act. Section 2. Definitions. 10 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 13 context clearly indicates otherwise: 14 "Adjusted monthly family income." Gross countable family

15 income per month, minus allowable deductions.

16 "Annual family income." The adjusted monthly family income,

1 multiplied by 12 months.

2 "CARES Act." The Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic
3 Security Act (Public Law 116-136, 134 Stat. 281).

4 "Caretaker." An individual who has legal custody of a child, 5 a foster parent of a child, a grandparent of a child or an aunt 6 or uncle of a child who lives with and exercises care and 7 control of the child.

8 "Child care." Care in lieu of parental care for part of a 9 24-hour day by an eligible provider, as defined in 55 Pa. Code § 10 3041.13(a) (relating to parent choice), or a relative of the 11 child who provides the care for the child if the relative 12 complies with the applicable State requirements for providing 13 the care.

14 "COVID-19." The coronavirus disease 2019, an infectious 15 disease caused by severe acute respiratory syndrome coronavirus 16 2 that was first identified during December 2019 in Wuhan, 17 China.

18 "Department." The Department of Community and Economic19 Development of the Commonwealth.

20 "Family." A child for whom subsidized child care is 21 requested and any of the following individuals who live with the 22 child in the same household:

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(1) A parent of the child.

(2) A caretaker and the caretaker's spouse.

(3) A biological, adoptive or foster child or stepchild
of the parent or caretaker who is under 18 years of age and
not emancipated by marriage or by the court.

(4) An unrelated child under the care and control of the
parent or caretaker who is under 18 years of age and not
emancipated by marriage or by the court.

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(5) A child who is:

2 (i) 18 years of age or older but under 22 years of 3 age;

4 (ii) enrolled in a high school, general educational
5 development program or postsecondary program leading to a
6 degree, diploma or certificate; and

7 (iii) wholly or partially dependent upon the income
8 of the parent or caretaker or spouse of the parent or
9 caretaker.

10 "FPIG." The Federal poverty income guidelines, which are the 11 income levels published annually in the Federal Register by the 12 United States Department of Health and Human Services.

13 "Fund." The COVID-19 Child Care Fund established under 14 section 4.

15 "Income." Includes the following:

(1) Earned income, including gross wages from work, cash
 and in-kind payments received by an individual in exchange
 for services and income from self-employment.

19 (2) Unearned income, including cash and contributions
 20 received by an individual for which the individual does not
 21 provide a service.

(3) Unearned benefits received periodically by an
 individual, such as unemployment compensation, workers'
 compensation or retirement benefits.

25 "Parent." A biological or adoptive mother or father,
26 stepmother or stepfather of a child who exercises care and
27 control of the child for whom subsidy is requested.

28 "Proclamation of disaster emergency." The proclamation of 29 disaster emergency issued by the Governor on March 6, 2020, 30 published in 50 Pa.B. 1644 (March 21, 2020), and any renewal of

1 the state of disaster emergency.

2 "Program." The COVID-19 Child Care Grant Program established 3 under section 3.

4 Section 3. COVID-19 Child Care Grant Program.

5 (a) Establishment.--The COVID-19 Child Care Grant Program is
6 established within the department.

7 (b) Duties of department.--The department shall provide 8 grants under the program in accordance with this act to 9 reimburse parents or caretakers for child care expenses incurred 10 as a result of COVID-19 as identified in the proclamation of 11 disaster emergency.

12 Section 4. COVID-19 Child Care Fund.

13 (a) Establishment.--The COVID-19 Child Care Fund is14 established as a special fund in the State Treasury.

15 (b) Use of fund.--Money appropriated under section 12 shall 16 be deposited into the fund to be used exclusively by the 17 department to award grants to parents or caretakers under the 18 program.

19 Section 5. Grant application forms.

(a) Development.--The department shall develop a grant
application form for parents or caretakers to apply for a grant
under the program.

(b) Contents.--At minimum, the grant application form shallinclude the following information:

(1) The name, address, contact information and annualfamily income of the applicant.

27 (2) The name, age and child care provider for each child28 of the applicant.

(3) The current cost of child care required and paid bythe applicant.

(4) The amount of grant money requested under the
 program.

3 (5) Any other information that the department deems4 necessary and appropriate.

5 (c) Submission.--A parent or caretaker must submit the grant 6 application form required under this section to the department 7 in the manner prescribed to be eligible for a grant under the 8 program.

9 Section 6. Eligibility.

10 Grant applications shall be open to all parents or caretakers 11 with annual family income greater than 200% of the FPIG but less 12 than 400% of the FPIG.

13 Section 7. Applicability.

14 This act shall apply to:

(1) Child care costs for a child from the birth of the child until the day prior to the date of the child's 14th birthday.

18 (2) At the discretion of the department, child care
19 costs for a child with a disability through 18 years of age.
20 Section 8. Award of grants.

(a) Review of grants.--Not later than 20 days after receipt of the grant application form under section 5, the department shall review the grant application form and determine whether to award a grant to the applicant under the program and, if so, the amount of grant money to be awarded.

(b) Consideration.--In determining the amount of grant money to be awarded to the applicant by the department, priority shall be given to applicants with gross annual family income greater than 200% of the FPIG but less than 300% of the FPIG.

30 (c) Notice.--After conducting a review of the grant

1 application under subsection (a), the department shall provide 2 written notice to the applicant of the award or denial of the 3 grant under the program. The following shall apply:

4 (1) Notice of the award of a grant under the program
5 shall include the amount of the grant money awarded and all
6 conditions or restrictions on the use of the grant money.

7 (2) Notice of the denial of all or part of the grant
8 money requested under the program on the grant application
9 under subsection (a) shall include the reasons for full or
10 partial denial.

11 Section 9. Guidelines.

12 The department may promulgate guidelines for the 13 implementation and administration of this act.

14 Section 10. Public notice.

15 (a) Availability of grants.--The department shall provide 16 information regarding the availability of grants under the 17 program on the publicly accessible Internet website of the 18 department.

(b) Amount of grant money awarded.--Following the termination or expiration of the proclamation of disaster emergency, the department shall post the amount of grant money awarded on the publicly accessible Internet website of the department.

24 Section 11. Limitation on award of grants.

25 Subject to the availability of funding, a grant to an 26 applicant under the program shall not exceed \$750 per month, per 27 child.

28 Section 12. Appropriation.

29 The sum of \$100,000,000 of the money available to the 30 Commonwealth under the CARES Act and any additional future

Federal dollars is appropriated to the department for the
 purpose of awarding grants to applicants under the program.
 Section 13. Expiration.

4 (a) Notice.--Upon the expiration or termination of the
5 proclamation of disaster emergency, the department shall
6 transmit notice of the expiration or termination to the
7 Legislative Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania
8 Bulletin.

9 (b) Authority.--The authority of the department to award 10 grants under the program shall expire three months after the 11 publication of the notice required in subsection (a).

12 Section 14. Effective date.

13 This act shall take effect in 30 days.
