AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for institution of higher 5 education application and process. 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 8 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an 10 11 article to read: 12 ARTICLE XX-A.2 13 INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION APPLICATION AND PROCESS Section 2001-A.2. Definitions. 14 15 The following words and phrases when used in this article 16 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the context clearly indicates otherwise: 17 "Institution." Includes any of the following: 18 19 (1) A community college operating under Article XIX-A.

1	(2) An institution within the State System of Higher
2	Education under Article XX-A.
3	(3) Any institution designated as State-related by the
4	Commonwealth, including:
5	(i) Lincoln University.
6	(ii) Temple University.
7	(iii) The Pennsylvania State University.
8	(iv) The University of Pittsburgh.
9	(v) Any associated branch campuses.
10	(4) The Thaddeus Stevens College of Technology.
11	(5) A rural regional college established under Article
12	XIX-G.
13	"Prospective student." An individual seeking enrollment at
14	an institution.
15	Section 2002-A.2. Institution application.
16	(a) Prohibitions Except as provided under subsection (b):
17	(1) an application developed and implemented by an
18	institution may not have any question related to or
19	information requested about the criminal history, including
20	juvenile history, of a prospective student; and
21	(2) an institution may not inquire about the criminal
22	history, including juvenile history, of a prospective student
23	at any time during the application process.
24	(b) Exceptions The following apply:
25	(1) The application and institution may inquire about
26	the criminal history of a prospective student regarding any
27	conviction for the following offenses:
28	(i) 18 Pa.C.S. § 2502 (relating to murder).
29	(ii) 18 Pa.C.S. § 2709.1 (relating to stalking).
30	(iii) 18 Pa.C.S. § 3121 (relating to rape).

1	(iv) 18 Pa.C.S. § 3122.1 (relating to statutory
2	sexual assault).
3	(v) 18 Pa.C.S. § 3124.1 (relating to sexual
4	assault).
5	(vi) 18 Pa.C.S. § 3125 (relating to aggravated
6	<pre>indecent assault).</pre>
7	(vii) 18 Pa.C.S. § 3126 (relating to indecent
8	assault).
9	(viii) Any similar offense under Federal law or the
10	<pre>law of another state.</pre>
11	(2) If an institution denies admission to a prospective
12	student based on a conviction of an offense under paragraph
13	(1), the institution shall notify the prospective student of
14	the denial and the prospective student may appeal the
15	decision to the institution.
16	(c) AdmissionUpon acceptance of a prospective student for
17	admission, an institution may inquire about the student's
18	criminal conviction history not limited to the offenses
19	enumerated under subsection (b)(1) for the following purposes:
20	(1) To offer voluntary counseling and support services,
21	including health, mental health and academic support
22	services.
23	(2) To obtain secondary information, including
24	information pertaining to housing. If an institution makes an
25	inquiry for the purposes under this paragraph, the
26	institution shall consider all of the following:
27	(i) The nature and gravity of the criminal conduct
28	and any direct relationship the criminal conduct has on a
29	student's participation in campus life, including campus
3 0	residency and campus-sponsored activities

1	(ii) The time that has elapsed since the occurrence
2	of the criminal conduct.
3	(iii) The age of the student at the time of the
4	occurrence of the criminal conduct.
5	(iv) Any evidence of rehabilitation and good conduct
6	displayed by the student.
7	(3) If the institution offers a teacher preparation
8	degree program, to obtain information that may affect the
9	teacher certification process or information that may be
10	required on the professional conduct form developed by the
11	Department of Education so that the institution may provide
12	counseling to assist a student in making an informed decision
13	about pursuing the program.
14	(4) To inform a student of any criminal conviction
15	history that may be considered on an application designed by
16	a national application service for admission to a specific
17	degree program.
1 2	Section 2. This act shall take affect in 60 days
