1 2 3 4	Providing for public reporting of certain information by police organizations; requiring police organizations to develop counseling programs for members; and imposing duties on the Municipal Police Officers Education and Training Commission.
5	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
6	hereby enacts as follows:
7	Section 1. Short title.
8	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Law
9	Enforcement Transparency Act.
10	Section 2. Definitions.
11	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
12	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
13	context clearly indicates otherwise:
14	"Commission." The Municipal Police Officers Education and
15	Training Commission.
16	"Police organization." A tax-exempt organization whose
17	members are required to complete commission certification under
18	53 Pa.C.S. Ch. 21 Subch. D (relating to municipal police

1 education and training) and acts as a collective bargaining
2 unit.

3 Section 3. Public reporting.

4 (a) General rule.--A police organization shall submit an
5 annual report to the commission by December 31 each year as
6 provided under this subsection. The commission shall publish the
7 report on its publicly accessible Internet website. The annual
8 report shall include the following:

9 (1) All Federal, State, county and municipal tax filings 10 that have been timely filed or paid in full as required.

All liabilities or debts held by the police

(2) All expenditures totaling over \$5,000.

13 organization totaling over \$5,000.

(4) All contributions received over \$200.

(5) All contributions made to campaigns, candidatecommittees and political action committees.

17 (6) All grants received from the Federal Government, the18 Commonwealth, a county or a municipality.

19 (7) Demographic information for the members of the 20 police organization which shall include race and ethnicity, 21 sex, age, education, geographic representation of residents 22 in a municipality, education level and years of service among 23 each level of employment classification with each collective 24 bargaining unit and subdivision.

(8) A comparison of the demographic information reported under paragraph (7) with demographics from the most recent census data provided by the United States Census Bureau for the municipalities that the police organization serves. The census demographics shall include, but not be limited to, age, sex, race and ethnicity and geographic representation.

(9) Any conflict of interest of leadership of the police
 organization with the county or municipality served.

3 (b) Posting by police organization.--A police organization
4 shall provide the information under subsection (a) (7) on its
5 publicly accessible Internet website.

6 (c) Timing.--All information required to be reported under
7 this section shall be posted within one year of the effective
8 date of this section.

9 Section 4. Counseling program.

10 (a) General rule.--A police organization shall develop a 11 counseling program to prevent future complaints against its 12 members and identify problematic behavior. A member shall 13 receive counseling from the program if:

14 (1) The police organization received a formal complaint15 against a member in their duties within the past three years.

16 (2) The member is included on a disclosure report
17 created by a district attorney for possible credibility
18 issues involving law enforcement officers.

(3) An applicant for a position in law enforcement
appears on a hiring report as required under 44 Pa.C.S. §
7311 (relating to hiring report).

(4) The member has signed a confidentiality agreement intheir capacity as a law enforcement officer.

(b) Resources.--A police organization shall use Pennsylvania
State Police resources when developing a counseling program
under this section.

27 Section 5. Effective date.

28 This act shall take effect in 90 days.
