AN ACT

25	for department heads and for gubernatorial appointments; in
26	organization of departmental administrative boards and
27	commissions and of advisory boards and commissions, further
28	providing for board to license private bankers; in -
29	Commonwealth agency fees, further providing for Department of
30	Banking and for Pennsylvania Securities Commission; in powers
31	and duties of the Department of Banking and its departmental
32	administrative board and commission, further providing for
