1 2 3 4 5 6 7 8 9 10	Repealing the act of April 25, 1933 (P.L.74, No.49), entitled "An act relating to baseball and football on Sunday; prohibiting baseball and football on Sunday during certain hours, and also during certain other hours unless the electors of a municipality are in favor of the same and, in certain cases, a license has first been secured from the municipal authorities; providing for referendums to ascertain the will of the electors, and for the enactment and repeal of licensing ordinances and resolutions in accordance therewith; providing penalties; and repealing inconsistent laws."
11	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
12	hereby enacts as follows:
13	Section 1. The act of April 25, 1933 (P.L.74, No.49),
14	referred to as the Sunday Baseball and Football Law, is
15	repealed:

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17	Section 1. Be it enacted, etc., ThatMunicipality
18	DefinedThe word "municipality," as used in this act, shall be
19	construed to mean and include any city, borough, town, and
20	township of this Commonwealth.
21	Section 2. Penalty for Unlawful Baseball and Football on
22	SundayIt shall be unlawful for any person, copartnership,
23	association or corporation to conduct, stage or engage in any
24	baseball or football game, regardless whether a charge or
25	admission thereto is made or whether labor or business is
26	necessary to conduct, manage, stage or operate the same, on the
27	first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, before the hour
28	of two o'clock post meridian or after the hour of six o'clock
29	post meridian.
30	It shall be unlawful for any person, copartnership,

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association or corporation to conduct, stage or engage in any 1 2 baseball or football game, regardless whether a charge or an admission thereto or incidental thereto is made or whether labor 3 or business is necessary to conduct, manage, stage or operate 4 the same, on the first day of the week, commonly called Sunday, 5 6 between the hours of two o'clock post meridian and six o'clock 7 post meridian, unless the voters in the municipality have first 8 voted in favor of baseball and football on Sunday as hereinafter provided, and unless the person, copartnership, association or 9 10 corporation, proposing to conduct or stage any such baseball or football game to which an admission charge is made or is 11 incidental, shall first have secured from the proper municipal 12 13 authority of the municipality a license authorizing him, her, or 14 it to conduct or stage such baseball or football game between said hours on Sunday. 15 16 Any person, copartnership, association or corporation violating any of the provisions of this section shall, upon 17 18 conviction thereof in a summary proceeding, be sentenced to pay 19 a fine not exceeding ten dollars (\$10), and, in default of the 20 payment of such fine and costs of prosecution, such person, or any member or agent of any copartnership or association, or any 21 22 officer or agent of any corporation, responsible for such 23 violation, shall be imprisoned for a period of not more than 24 five days. Section 3. Ordinances and Resolutions; License Fees.--If at 25 26 the election in the year one thousand nine hundred and thirtythree, as hereinafter provided, a majority of the electors in 27 any municipality, voting at said election, vote in favor of 28 29 baseball and football on Sunday between the hours of two o'clock 30 post meridian and six o'clock post meridian, then each

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municipality, other than a township of the second class, shall, 1 2 by ordinance, and each township of the second class shall, by resolution of the township supervisors, provide for the 3 licensing of baseball and football games to which an admission 4 fee is charged or is incidental on Sunday between the hours of 5 two o'clock post meridian and six o'clock post meridian. If the 6 7 vote of the electors in the municipality was not in favor of 8 baseball and football, then no ordinance or resolution providing 9 for the licensing of baseball and football games shall be 10 enacted or adopted. 11 The license fees to be charged, under any such ordinance or resolution, for any baseball or football game to which an 12 13 admission is charged or is incidental shall not exceed the 14 following amounts: In cities of the first and second class, fifty dollars (\$50); in cities of the second class A and third 15 16 class, twenty-five dollars (\$25); in boroughs, five dollars (\$5); and in townships, one dollar (\$1). 17 18 All license fees collected under the provisions of any such 19 ordinance or resolution shall be paid into the treasury of the 20 municipality. 21 Section 4. Referendum; Statement of Question on Ballots. -- At the municipal election in the year one thousand nine hundred and 22 23 thirty-three, there shall be submitted, in the manner provided 24 by the election laws of the Commonwealth, a question to 25 determine the will of the electors of each municipality in this Commonwealth with respect to baseball and football games on 26 Sunday. Such question shall be in the following form--27 Do you favor the conduct, staging and playing of 28 29 baseball and football games, regardless of whether Yes an admission charge is made or incidental thereto 30

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1	or whether labor or business is necessary to conduct,
2	stage or operate the same, between the hours of two No
3	and six, post meridian, on Sunday?
4	The said question shall be printed on separate official
5	ballots, in bound form, by the county commissioners of each
6	county, and sufficient number of ballots shall be furnished to
7	the election officers in each election district of the county so
8	that one ballot may be supplied to each voter at such election.
9	In districts where voting machines are used, such question shall
10	appear on the face of the machine where the machine is properly
11	equipped for such purposes.
12	Section 5. Returns and Computation of VotesThe votes cast
13	on such question shall be counted by the election officers and
14	returns thereof made by them, and by election officers where
15	voting machines are used, to the prothonotary of the county, who
16	shall lay the same before the return board for computation at
17	the same time and in the same manner as other returns. The
18	return board shall compute the said returns by municipalities
19	and certify the results of the vote cast on the question to the
20	legislative body of each municipality within the county.
21	Such election shall be governed by the election laws of the
22	Commonwealth, and all penalties provided by said laws shall
23	apply to such elections.
24	Section 6. Future ReferendumsIn any municipality the will
25	of the electors with respect to baseball and football on Sunday
26	may, after the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three,
27	but not oftener than once in three years, be ascertained, and
28	the question, as provided in this act, shall be submitted to the
29	electors of any municipality upon demand, in writing, of
30	petitioners equal to at least five per centum of the highest
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vote cast for any office in the municipality at the last 1 2 preceding general or municipal election. Such petition shall be 3 filed with the corporate authorities at least sixty days before the day of any general or municipal election at which the 4 question is to be submitted, and, if the petition is 5 sufficiently signed, shall thereupon be certified to the county 6 7 commissioners, who shall cause such question to be submitted in 8 the same manner as is provided in this act for the election in 9 the year one thousand nine hundred and thirty-three. 10 If a majority of the electors, voting in any municipality which licenses baseball and football games to which an admission 11 charge is made or is incidental, are not in favor of such 12 13 licensing, then the ordinance or resolution licensing such 14 baseball and football games shall be repealed; but if a majority of the electors in any such municipality which does not license 15 16 baseball and football games are in favor of such licensing, then an ordinance or resolution shall be enacted or adopted licensing 17 18 baseball and football games to which an admission charge is made 19 or is incidental, as provided in this act. 20 Section 7. Intent of Act .-- It is the intent of this act to provide a method whereby the will of the electors of each 21 municipality with respect to baseball and football games on 22 23 Sunday between the hours of two o'clock post meridian and six 24 o'clock post meridian may be ascertained, and it shall be the 25 duty of the legislative body of each municipality to enact, adopt or repeal any ordinance or resolution in accordance with 26 the will of the electors as ascertained at said elections. In 27 case of a failure so to do, the duty herein imposed upon the 28 29 legislative body of any municipality may be enforced by 30 mandamus.

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1	Section 8. RepealSection one of the act, approved the
2	twenty-second day of April, one thousand seven hundred and
3	ninety-four (3 Sm. L. 177), entitled "An act for the prevention
4	of vice and immorality and of unlawful gaming, and to restrain
5	disorderly sports and dissipation," be, and the same is hereby,
6	repealed in so far as it prohibits baseball and football games
7	on Sunday.
8	Section 9. ConstitutionalityThe provisions of this act
9	are severable, and if any of the provisions hereof are held to
10	be unconstitutional, the decision shall not be construed to
11	impair any other provision of this act. It is hereby declared as
12	the legislative intent that this act would have been adopted had
13	such unconstitutional provision not been included herein.
14	Section 10. Hunting and FishingNothing contained in this
15	act shall relate to Sunday hunting and fishing or be construed
16	as repealing any law relating thereto.
17	Section 11. Effective DateThis act shall be effective
18	immediately upon final enactment.]

19 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
