## AN ACT

- Amending Title 18 (Crimes and Offenses) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for the offense of criminal surveillance. 3
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 18 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a section to read:
- 8 § 3505. Criminal surveillance.
- (a) Offense defined. -- A person commits the crime of criminal
- surveillance if he engages in surveillance while trespassing in 10
- 11 a private place.
- 12 (b) Separate violations. -- A separate violation of this
- 13 section shall occur:
- 14 (1) for each victim of an offense under subsection (a)
- 15 under the same or similar circumstances pursuant to one
- scheme or course of conduct whether at the same or different 16

- 1 time; or
- 2 (2) if a person is a victim of an offense under
- 3 subsection (a) on more than one occasion during a separate
- 4 <u>course of conduct either individually or otherwise.</u>
- 5 (c) Penalties.--
- 6 (1) A single violation of this section shall constitute
- 7 <u>a summary offense.</u>
- 8 (2) Multiple violations of this section shall constitute
- 9 <u>a misdemeanor of the third degree.</u>
- 10 (d) Exceptions. -- Subsection (a) shall not apply if the
- 11 conduct proscribed under subsection (a) is done by any of the
- 12 following:
- 13 <u>(1) Law enforcement officers during a lawful criminal</u>
- 14 <u>investigation</u>.
- 15 (2) Law enforcement officers, personnel of the
- 16 <u>Department of Corrections or a local correctional facility</u>,
- 17 prison or jail for security purposes or during investigation
- 18 of alleged misconduct by a person in the custody of the
- 19 Department of Corrections or local authorities.
- 20 (3) A person who is a passenger or pilot of an aircraft
- 21 operating in a manner consistent with 74 Pa.C.S. § 5501
- 22 (relating to ownership of space).
- 23 (e) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 24 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 25 subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 26 "Aircraft." The term as defined in 74 Pa.C.S. § 5102
- 27 <u>(relating to definitions).</u>
- 28 "Private place." A place where a person may reasonably
- 29 expect to be safe from casual or hostile intrusion or
- 30 surveillance.

- 1 <u>"Surveillance." Observation of the activities of another</u>
- 2 person or invading the privacy of the person observed.
- 3 "Trespassing." Entering or remaining, or causing any
- 4 <u>instrument or device equipped with technology to facilitate</u>
- 5 <u>surveillance to enter or remain</u>, on the land or in the airspace
- 6 of another, by one who knows he is not authorized or privileged
- 7 to do so.
- 8 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
