AN ACT

Amending Title 42 (Judiciary and Judicial Procedure) of the 1 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in matters affecting 2 government units, further providing for exceptions to 3 sovereign immunity and for limitations on damages. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: Section 1. Section 8522(b) of Title 42 of the Pennsylvania 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a paragraph to read: 8 § 8522. Exceptions to sovereign immunity. * * * 10 11 (b) Acts which may impose liability. -- The following acts by 12 a Commonwealth party may result in the imposition of liability on the Commonwealth and the defense of sovereign immunity shall 13 not be raised to claims for damages caused by: 14 * * * 15 16 (10) Wrongful imprisonment. -- Damages under this paragraph shall not exceed the following: 17 18 (i) a sum equal to twice the amount of the gross

- 1 wages of the plaintiff earned in the year prior to his 2 arrest or \$25,000, whichever is greater, for each year of 3 wrongful imprisonment; (ii) reasonable attorney fees and court costs 4 incurred by the plaintiff as a result of the wrongful 5
- (iii) restitution in an amount equal to the fines, 7 surcharges and penalties incurred by the plaintiff as a 8 result of the wrongful conviction.
