## AN ACT

Amending the act of May 22, 1951 (P.L.317, No.69), entitled, as amended, "An act relating to the practice of professional nursing; providing for the licensing of nurses and for the 3 revocation and suspension of such licenses, subject to 4 appeal, and for their reinstatement; providing for the renewal of such licenses; regulating nursing in general; 7 prescribing penalties and repealing certain laws," providing for delegation of functions necessary for the support of 8 nursing services. 9 10 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 11 12 Section 1. Section 2 of the act of May 22, 1951 (P.L.317, No.69), known as The Professional Nursing Law, is amended by 13 adding a definition to read: 14 15 Section 2. Definitions .-- When used in this act, the following words and phrases shall have the following meanings 17 unless the context provides otherwise: 18 (16) "Delegate" or "delegation" means the transfer of 19

- 1 responsibility for the performance of a task FUNCTION from the <-
- 2 professional REGISTERED nurse to another individual who may or <-
- 3 may not be a health care <del>provider</del> PRACTITIONER, licensed or <--
- 4 <u>unlicensed</u>, while retaining accountability for the outcome.
- 5 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 6 <u>Section 4.2. Delegation of Functions.--(a) A registered</u>
- 7 nurse may delegate if all of the following conditions are met:
- 8 (1) The delegation is consistent with the scope and
- 9 standards of acceptable nursing practice as defined by license
- 10 or certificate or otherwise authorized by law.
- 11 (2) The delegation is not prohibited by statute or
- 12 regulation, including regulations promulgated by the board <--
- 13 <u>BOARD.</u> <--
- 14 (3) The registered nurse has knowledge that the delegate <--
- 15 <u>INDIVIDUAL TO WHOM THE FUNCTION IS BEING DELEGATED has the</u> <--
- 16 requisite education, training, experience and continued
- 17 competency to safely perform the delegated task FUNCTION. <--
- 18 (4) The registered nurse has determined that the delegation
- 19 does not create an undue risk to the patient.
- 20 (b) A registered nurse shall be responsible for the
- 21 delegated nursing function in accordance with subsection (a). A <--
- 22 <u>registered nurse's responsibility for the delegated nursing</u> <--
- 23 function is not limited by any provisions of this section.
- 24 <u>(c) A registered nurse may not delegate a task FUNCTION</u> <--
- 25 that:
- 26 (1) requires knowledge and skill not ordinarily possessed by <--
- 27 a nonregistered nurse BEYOND THE VALIDATED COMPETENCIES OF THE <-
- 28 INDIVIDUAL TO WHOM THE FUNCTION IS BEING DELEGATED; or
- 29 (2) the registered nurse is not educated, trained and
- 30 <u>competent to perform.</u>

- 1 (d) Nothing in this section may be construed as limiting the
- 2 <u>authority of a physician to delegate as contained within the act</u>
- 3 of December 20, 1985 (P.L.457, No.112), known as the "Medical <--
- 4 Practice Act of 1985."
- 5 (e) Within 180 ONE HUNDRED EIGHTY (180) days of the <--
- 6 effective date of this section, the board BOARD shall promulgate <--
- 7 regulations that establish criteria pursuant to which a
- 8 <u>registered nurse may delegate the performance of nursing</u> <--
- 9 functions.
- 10 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days. AS <--
- 11 FOLLOWS:
- 12 (1) THE FOLLOWING PROVISIONS SHALL TAKE EFFECT
- 13 IMMEDIATELY:
- 14 (I) THIS SECTION.
- 15 (II) THE ADDITION OF SECTION 4.2(E) OF THE ACT.
- 16 (2) THE REMAINDER OF THIS ACT SHALL TAKE EFFECT ON THE
- 17 EFFECTIVE DATE OF THE REGULATIONS PROMULGATED UNDER SECTION
- 18 4.2(E) OF THE ACT.
