AN ACT

- Amending Title 72 (Taxation and Fiscal Affairs) of the
 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for financial
 transparency.

 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Title 72 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
- 7 Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 11 <u>501</u>. <u>Definitions</u>.
- 12 <u>502</u>. State Treasury transparency portal.
- 13 <u>503</u>. <u>Duties of Commonwealth agencies</u>.
- 14 § 501. Definitions.
- The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 16 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 17 <u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- "Commonwealth agency." Any office, authority, board,

- 1 multistate agency or commission of the executive branch, an
- 2 independent agency or a State-affiliated entity. The term
- 3 includes any of the following:
- 4 <u>(1) The Governor's Office.</u>
- 5 (2) The Office of Attorney General.
- 6 (3) The Department of the Auditor General.
- 7 <u>(4) The Treasury Department.</u>
- 8 (5) An organization established by the Constitution of
- 9 <u>Pennsylvania, a statute or an executive order which performs</u>
- or is intended to perform an essential government function.
- 11 <u>(6) A legislative agency.</u>
- 12 <u>(7) A judicial agency.</u>
- 13 "Independent agency." Any office, authority, board or agency
- 14 of the Commonwealth that is not subject to the policy,
- 15 <u>supervision or control of the Governor.</u>
- 16 "Judicial agency." Any of the following:
- 17 (1) The Supreme Court of Pennsylvania.
- 18 (2) The Superior Court of Pennsylvania.
- 19 (3) The Commonwealth Court of Pennsylvania.
- 20 (4) The Administrative Office of Pennsylvania Courts.
- 21 "Legislative agency." As defined in section 102 of the act
- 22 of February 14, 2008 (P.L.6, No.3), known as the Right-to-Know
- 23 <u>Law.</u>
- 24 <u>"State-affiliated agency."</u> Any of the following:
- 25 (1) The Pennsylvania Gaming Control Board.
- 26 (2) The Pennsylvania Housing Finance Agency.
- 27 <u>(3) The State System of Higher Education.</u>
- 28 § 502. State Treasury transparency portal.
- 29 <u>(a) Development.--The State Treasurer shall develop and</u>
- 30 maintain on the Treasury Department's publicly accessible

1	Internet website a transparency portal with information relating
2	to the Commonwealth's finances. The following shall apply:
3	(1) The transparency portal shall be made available to
4	the public and include figures and visual aids to demonstrate
5	growth or reduction in expenditures and revenue starting no
6	later than the 2016-2017 fiscal year.
7	(2) The visual aids required under paragraph (1) shall
8	include, but not be limited to, charts and graphs.
9	(3) Information provided by the Treasury Department
10	shall be made available to the public to download as an image
11	and spreadsheet document.
12	(b) General Fund information The following shall apply:
13	(1) The State Treasurer shall provide on the
14	transparency portal an analysis of the General Fund updated
15	to accurately reflect the General Fund at the end of the
16	<pre>prior day, including:</pre>
17	(i) Cash flow within the General Fund, which shall
18	include a line graph showing changes in cash flow with a
19	range starting from the 2016-2017 fiscal year.
20	(ii) The current General Fund balance.
21	(iii) General Fund expenditures. The public shall be
22	able to delineate expenditures under this subparagraph by
23	appropriation paid out of the General Fund by the
24	Commonwealth agency that made the expenditure.
25	(iv) General Fund revenues, including information
26	relating to the difference between estimated revenues
27	provided by the Independent Fiscal Office under section
28	605-B of the act of April 9, 1929 (P.L.177, No.175),
29	known as The Administrative Code of 1929, for the given
30	fiscal year and actual revenues collected. The Treasury

1	Department shall also include a graph comparing changes
2	within the General Fund revenues and General Fund
3	expenditures starting with the 2019-2020 fiscal year.
4	(2) In order to assist the State Treasurer in compiling
5	the information required under this subsection for the
6	analysis of the General Fund, each Commonwealth agency shall
7	provide the information to the Treasury Department in a file
8	format specified by the Treasury Department through interface
9	<u>files.</u>
10	(c) Budget information The State Treasurer shall provide
11	on the transparency portal information relating to the General
12	Fund to accurately reflect the Commonwealth's finances at the
13	end of the close of business the previous day, including:
14	(1) Expenditures from each of the Commonwealth's special
15	or restricted accounts, including a breakdown of Commonwealth
16	agency expenditures from within those funds.
17	(2) Daily changes in revenue and expenditures for the
18	Commonwealth's special and restricted funds.
19	(3) In order to implement this subsection, each
20	Commonwealth agency shall provide the Treasury Department
21	data collected under the act of June 30, 2011 (P.L.81,
22	No.18), known as the Pennsylvania Web Accountability and
23	Transparency (PennWATCH) Act, in a file format stipulated by
24	the Treasury Department through interface files.
25	(d) Treasury investment information The State Treasurer
26	shall provide information on the transparency portal relating to
27	the Commonwealth's investments managed by the Treasury
28	Department. The information shall include the daily balances of
29	each fund within the investment pools managed by the Treasury

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Department. The State Treasurer shall ensure that the

- 1 <u>information</u> is updated to reflect changes in investment pools
- 2 and account balances from the close of business the previous
- 3 day.
- 4 (e) Commonwealth programs. -- The State Treasurer shall
- 5 <u>include in the transparency portal an analysis of the</u>
- 6 appropriations for Commonwealth programs based on the
- 7 appropriations at the close of business for the prior day. The
- 8 <u>analysis shall include each appropriation, total budgeted</u>
- 9 appropriation, total augmenting revenue, total spent
- 10 appropriation and percentage of the total appropriation spent.
- 11 (f) Commonwealth Financial Watch.--The State Treasurer shall
- 12 include in the transparency portal a Commonwealth Financial
- 13 Watch which includes:
- 14 (1) The top 20 highest expenditures as designated by
- 15 <u>appropriation within the General Fund during the current</u>
- fiscal year starting with the 2019-2020 fiscal year.
- 17 (2) The 10 Commonwealth agencies with the highest dollar
- 18 amount of General Fund expenditures during the current fiscal
- 19 year starting with the 2019-2020 fiscal year, including the
- 20 percent of the Commonwealth agency's General Fund
- 21 appropriation spent.
- 22 (g) Time period. -- All information provided under this
- 23 section shall reflect changes within the Commonwealth's funds
- 24 starting no later than the 2019-2020 fiscal year.
- 25 § 503. Duties of Commonwealth agencies.
- A Commonwealth agency shall provide the State Treasurer with
- 27 the data required for the operation of the transparency portal
- 28 under section 502 (relating to State Treasury transparency
- 29 portal) in a file format stipulated by the Treasury Department
- 30 through interface files.

1 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 90 days.
