AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), entitled "An act relating to health care; prescribing the powers and 2 duties of the Department of Health; establishing and 3 providing the powers and duties of the State Health Coordinating Council, health systems agencies and Health Care Policy Board in the Department of Health, and State Health 6 Facility Hearing Board in the Department of Justice; providing for certification of need of health care providers 8 and prescribing penalties," in licensing of health care facilities, providing for dialysis centers. 10 11 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 12 hereby enacts as follows: 13 Section 1. The act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48), known 14 as the Health Care Facilities Act, is amended by adding a 15 section to read: Section 823. Dialysis centers. 16 17 (a) Ratios. -- A facility in this Commonwealth that is 18 licensed by the Centers for Medicare and Medicaid Services 19 offering dialysis services on an inpatient or outpatient basis
- 21 four patients actively receiving dialysis services. The facility

shall maintain a minimum of one dialysis caregiver for every

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- 1 shall provide sufficient care to meet the needs of each patient.
- 2 All facilities that are licensed by the Centers for Medicare and
- 3 Medicaid Services offering dialysis services, whether or not
- 4 <u>owned by a hospital or the Commonwealth, shall adhere to the</u>
- 5 <u>staffing ratio under this section.</u>
- 6 (b) Definitions.--As used in this section, the following
- 7 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 8 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 9 "Dialysis caregiver." The following individuals who are
- 10 trained in dialysis procedures and direct patient care during
- 11 treatment, including initiation of treatment, termination of
- 12 <u>treatment and monitoring vital signs:</u>
- 13 <u>(1) A physician.</u>
- 14 (2) A physician assistant.
- 15 (3) A nurse practitioner.
- 16 <u>(4) A registered nurse.</u>
- 17 (5) A licensed practical nurse.
- 18 (6) A dialysis technician.
- 19 "Dialysis services." Hemodialysis or peritoneal dialysis
- 20 used to treat end-stage renal disease.
- 21 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
