Amending Title 61 (Prisons and Parole) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in inmate labor, further providing for 2 inmates accounts and providing for skilled labor and for 3 participation and refusal to work. 4 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Section 3124(b) of Title 61 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended and the section is amended by adding a subsection to read: 10 § 3124. Inmates accounts. 11 12 (b) Contents of accounts. -- In the account, the department 13 shall credit the inmate with wages for the time the inmate is 14 actually engaged in work. [The rate of the wage and the amount

credited to each inmate shall be determined at the discretion of

the department.]

- inmate under subsection (b) shall be a minimum of \$5 per 19

- 1 hour.
- 2 (2) The department shall determine a graduated wage
- 3 scale based on experience and level of skill needed to
- 4 perform the inmate's job.
- 5 (3) The department shall provide annual bonuses to
- 6 <u>inmate workers with the amount to be determined at the</u>
- 7 <u>discretion of the department.</u>
- 8 Section 2. Title 61 is amended by adding sections to read:
- 9 <u>§ 3124.1. Skilled labor.</u>
- 10 (a) Education. -- The department shall provide education for
- 11 <u>an inmate to become certificated in skilled labor.</u>
- 12 (b) Definitions. -- As used in this section, the following
- 13 words and phrases shall have the meanings given to them in this
- 14 <u>subsection unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 15 "Skilled labor." A segment of the workforce that requires
- 16 <u>specialized training</u>, <u>education or experience to complete</u>
- 17 complex physical or mental tasks.
- 18 § 3124.2. Participation and refusal to work.
- 19 An inmate may choose to work or take part in the educational
- 20 or vocational programs provided by the department. An inmate may
- 21 <u>not be placed in solitary confinement, punished or retaliated</u>
- 22 <u>against in any way for refusing to work.</u>
- 23 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
