AN ACT

Providing for access to $\frac{1}{1}$ CONGREGATE care facilities for $\frac{1}{1}$ 1 essential caregivers, for additional safety requirements for 2 residents of long term CONGREGATE care facilities, for 3 suspension of access for essential caregivers and for 4 personal protective equipment for essential caregivers. 5 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Short title. 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Access to Long-Term CONGREGATE Care Facilities Act. 10 <--Section 2. Definitions. 11 12 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall 13 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 14 context clearly indicates otherwise: 15 "CONGREGATE CARE FACILITY." A FACILITY LICENSED BY THE <--16 DEPARTMENT OR THE DEPARTMENT OF HUMAN SERVICES, INCLUDING, BUT 17 NOT LIMITED TO, A LONG-TERM CARE NURSING FACILITY, A SKILLED

NURSING FACILITY, AN ASSISTED LIVING FACILITY, A PERSONAL CARE

- 1 HOME, AN INDEPENDENT LONG-TERM CARE FACILITY OR AN INTERMEDIATE
- 2 CARE FACILITY FOR INDIVIDUALS WITH INTELLECTUAL DISABILITIES.
- 3 "Declaration of disaster emergency." A disaster emergency
- 4 declared by the Governor under 35 Pa.C.S. § 7301(c) (relating to
- 5 general authority of Governor).
- 6 "Department." The Department of Health of the Commonwealth.
- 7 "Essential caregiver." An individual, whether a family
- 8 member or friend of a resident of a long term CONGREGATE care

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- 9 facility, who is designated by the resident or appointed by an
- 10 individual with decision-making authority for the resident to
- 11 provide physical or emotional support to the resident during a
- 12 declaration of disaster emergency.
- 13 "Long-term care facility." A facility licensed by the
- 14 department or the Department of Human Services, including, but-
- 15 not limited to, a long-term care nursing facility, a skilled-
- 16 nursing facility, an assisted living facility, a personal care-
- 17 home, an older adult daily living center, an independent long-
- 18 term care facility or an intermediate care facility for
- 19 individuals with intellectual disabilities.
- 20 Section 3. Access to long term CONGREGATE care facilities for
- 21 essential caregivers.
- The department, in consultation with the Department of Human
- 23 Services, shall establish protocols to allow a resident of a
- 24 long term CONGREGATE care facility or an individual with
- 25 decision-making authority for the resident to designate an
- 26 individual as the resident's essential caregiver during a
- 27 declaration of disaster emergency. A RESIDENT OF A CONGREGATE <--
- 28 CARE FACILITY OR AN INDIVIDUAL WITH DECISION-MAKING AUTHORITY
- 29 FOR THE RESIDENT SHALL DESIGNATE AN ESSENTIAL CAREGIVER DURING
- 30 THE INTAKE OF THE RESIDENT INTO THE CONGREGATE CARE FACILITY. An

- 1 essential caregiver shall meet the necessary qualifications to
- 2 enter the long term CONGREGATE care facility to provide in-
- 3 person physical or emotional support to a resident of a long-

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- 4 term CONGREGATE care facility in accordance with the protocols <--
- 5 established under this section. The protocols shall include all
- 6 of the following:
- 7 (1) Safety measures for an essential caregiver,
- 8 including, but not limited to, restrictions on travel,
- 9 enhanced testing for communicable diseases and the necessary
- safety equipment required to protect the health and safety of
- 11 the residents of the long-term CONGREGATE care facility.
- 12 (2) Procedures to replace an essential caregiver due to
- 13 necessary circumstances, including illness or death of the
- 14 essential caregiver.
- 15 (3) A duration, not to exceed 30 days AFTER A <--
- DECLARATION OF DISASTER EMERGENCY, when a long term <--
- 17 CONGREGATE care facility may enter a lock-down phase for the <--
- 18 purpose of establishing safety measures for residents of the
- 19 long-term CONGREGATE care facility and essential caregivers. <--
- 20 IF A CONGREGATE CARE FACILITY REQUIRES AN EXTENSION OF THE
- 21 LOCK-DOWN PHASE UNDER THIS PARAGRAPH, THE CONGREGATE CARE
- 22 FACILITY SHALL REQUIRE STAFF OF THE CONGREGATE CARE FACILITY
- 23 TO REMAIN IN THE CONGREGATE CARE FACILITY DURING THE EXTENDED
- 24 PERIOD TO PREVENT THE POTENTIAL SPREAD OF A COMMUNICABLE
- 25 DISEASE TO THE CONGREGATE CARE FACILITY.
- 26 Section 4. Additional safety requirements for residents of
- 28 (A) ADDITIONAL SAFETY REQUIREMENTS.--A long-term CONGREGATE <--
- 29 care facility may establish REASONABLE, additional safety
- 30 requirements to protect the residents of the long term

- 1 CONGREGATE care facility if the requirements meet all of the
- 2 following criteria:
- 3 (1) The requirements are directly linked to a
- 4 declaration of disaster emergency.
- 5 (2) The requirements are not so burdensome and onerous
- 6 as to substantially prevent an essential caregiver from being
- 7 able to physically or emotionally support a resident of the
- 8 long-term CONGREGATE care facility in person.
- 9 (B) COSTS.--AN ESSENTIAL CAREGIVER SHALL PAY THE COSTS OF <--

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- 10 THE REASONABLE, ADDITIONAL SAFETY MEASURES ESTABLISHED UNDER
- 11 SUBSECTION (A). A CONGREGATE CARE FACILITY MAY NOT PAY THE COSTS
- 12 OF THE REASONABLE, ADDITIONAL SAFETY MEASURES ESTABLISHED UNDER
- 13 SUBSECTION (A).
- 14 Section 5. Suspension of access for essential caregivers.
- 15 A long-term CONGREGATE care facility may suspend access to <--
- 16 the long term CONGREGATE care facility for an essential
- 17 caregiver who violates the protocols established under section
- 18 3, and the long term CONGREGATE care facility shall allow the
- 19 resident, or an individual with decision-making authority for
- 20 the resident, to immediately designate a replacement essential
- 21 caregiver.
- 22 Section 6. Personal protective equipment for essential
- caregivers.
- 24 A long term CONGREGATE care facility may require an essential <--
- 25 caregiver to provide personal protective equipment for himself
- 26 or herself or assume the cost of the personal protective
- 27 equipment provided by the facility to allow the essential
- 28 caregiver to provide in-person physical or emotional support.
- 29 Section 7. Applicability.
- 30 This act shall apply for the period commencing 15 days after

- 1 a declaration of disaster emergency and 60 days after the
- 2 termination or expiration of the declaration of disaster
- 3 emergency by executive order, proclamation or operation of law.
- 4 Section 8. Construction.
- 5 Nothing in this act shall be construed to supersede Federal
- 6 authority OR GUIDANCE regarding long term CONGREGATE care
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- 7 facilities or to prevent the department or Department of Human
- 8 Services from taking necessary actions to render the
- 9 Commonwealth eligible for Federal funds or reimbursement
- 10 services provided in long-term CONGREGATE care facilities. <-
- 11 Section 9. Effective date.
- 12 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
