## AN ACT

1 2	Amending Title 20 (Decedents, Estates and Fiduciaries) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, providing for autopsies.
3	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
4	hereby enacts as follows:
5	Section 1. Title 20 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated
6	Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

10	8901. Definitions.
11	8902. Preparation of autopsy audiovisual material.
12	8903. Confidentiality.

14	<u>§ 8901. Definitions.</u>
15	The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
16	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
17	context clearly indicates otherwise:

1	<u>"Autopsy." An examination of a body after death to determine &lt;</u>		
2	the:		
3	(1) cause of death; or		
4	(2) character and extent of changes produced by disease		
5	<u>or injury.</u>		
6	"Autopsy audiovisual material." Any of the following:		
7	(1) A photograph of the body of a decedent taken during		
8	<u>an autopsy.</u>		
9	(2) A video recording of an autopsy.		
10	(3) An audio recording of an autopsy.		
11	"Investigative or law enforcement officer." Any officer of		
12	the United States, of another state or subdivision of another		
13	state, or of the Commonwealth or a political subdivision of the		
14	Commonwealth, who is empowered by law to conduct investigations		
15	of or to make arrests for offenses enumerated in 18 Pa.C.S.		
16	(relating to crimes and offenses) or an equivalent crime in		
17	another jurisdiction and any attorney authorized by law to		
18	prosecute or participate in the prosecution of such offense.		
19	<u>§ 8902. Preparation of autopsy audiovisual material.</u>		
20	(a) General ruleAutopsy audiovisual material may not be		
21	prepared by an individual unless the individual has the written		
22	<u>consent of:</u>		
23	(1) the physician performing the autopsy; or		
24	(2) the coroner or medical examiner authorized by law to		
25	perform or order the autopsy.		
26	(b) ConstructionNothing in this section may be construed		
27	to apply to an investigative or law enforcement officer who		
28	prepares autopsy audiovisual material in the course of the		
29	officer's duty or to administrative and managerial personnel,		
30	consultants and contractors working at the direction of an		
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1	investigative or law enforcement officer who prepares autopsy
2	audiovisual material in the course of the officer's duty.
3	<u>§ 8903. Confidentiality.</u>
4	(a) General rule
5	(1) Except as set forth under subsection (b), autopsy
6	audiovisual material is confidential. Autopsy audiovisual
7	material may not be released by any of the following:
8	(i) The physician, coroner or medical examiner who
9	performed or ordered the autopsy.
10	(ii) An individual who assisted the physician,
11	coroner or medical examiner under subparagraph (i).
12	(iii) An individual who participated in the
13	preparation of autopsy audiovisual material.
14	(iv) The facility where the autopsy was performed.
15	(2) Autopsy audiovisual material shall not be deemed
16	official records and papers of the coroner and shall not be
17	subject to section 1251 of the act of August 9, 1955
18	(P.L.323, No.130), known as The County Code.
19	(b) ExceptionSubsection (a) does not apply to a release
20	of autopsy audiovisual material in any of the following
21	<u>circumstances:</u>
22	(1) Pursuant to consent of the decedent or a personal
23	representative, except that during an investigation by law
24	enforcement or a coroner, the information shall only be
25	released in accordance with paragraph 5(ii) and (iii).
26	(2) To an investigative or law enforcement officer for
27	use in the course of the officer's duty.
28	(3) To the coroner or medical examiner for use in the
29	performance of official duties or training, including
30	conferral with medical or scientific experts, for teaching

2	(4) When an autopsy is conducted pursuant to consent of
3	the decedent or personal representative, to a physician who
4	uses the materials for teaching, training or publication in a
5	medical or scientific journal or textbook, provided the
6	identity of the decedent is redacted so as to reasonably
7	render the decedent anonymous.
8	(5) To a person pursuant to a court order of public
9	necessity or, during litigation, pursuant to a court order.
10	For an order under this paragraph, the following apply:
11	(i) There must be notice to the personal
12	representative of the subject decedent.
13	(ii) There must be a hearing.
14	(iii) The court must determine, based upon clear and
15	convincing evidence, all of the following:
16	(A) Release of the autopsy audiovisual material
17	is necessary to protect public health or safety or is
18	material and relevant to the litigation.
19	(B) The necessity under clause (A) overrides the
20	privacy interest of the decedent and the family of
21	the decedent.
22	<u>§ 8904. Penalties.</u>
23	(a) PreparationAn individual who violates section 8902
24	(relating to preparation of autopsy audiovisual material)
25	commits a misdemeanor of the second degree.
26	(b) ConfidentialityAn individual who violates section
27	8903 (relating to confidentiality) commits a misdemeanor of the
28	<u>first degree.</u>
29	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.

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
