## AN ACT

- Amending the act of July 10, 1986 (P.L.1396, No.121), entitled 1

- 8 Section 1. Section 5(a) of the act of July 10, 1986
- (P.L.1396, No.121), known as the Women's, Infants' and
- Children's Nutrition Improvement Act, is amended to read: 10
- 11 Section 5. Program operation.
- 12 Eligibility of participants. -- Participants in the WIC
- Program enrolled through the use of [funds] money available 13
- 14 under the State supplement shall be subject to the same
- 15 eligibility criteria prescribed by the Federal Government for
- the existing WIC Program. For purposes of WIC Program 16
- eligibility, an applicant shall have the option to 17
- electronically submit documentation to a local WIC Program 18

- 1 agency prior to the applicant's eligibility appointment in a
- 2 manner prescribed by the department and described in a
- 3 promulgated regulation.

- 5 Section 2. The sum of \$12,000,000 is appropriated to the
- 6 Department of Health for the purposes of technological
- 7 improvements or enhancements for program operations of the food
- 8 program for women, infants and children, including efficacy and
- 9 efficiency and incorporating the use of technology and
- 10 modernization tools that remove barriers for persons eligible
- 11 for WIC and creating the potential to allow participants to load
- 12 benefits remotely and purchase WIC benefits online.
- 13 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
