## AN ACT

- 1 Prohibiting employees of long-term care providers from serving
- as guardian, agent under a power of attorney, insurance or
- annuity beneficiary or estate executor of individuals who
- 4 receive services from a long-term care provider.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. Short title.
- 8 This act shall be known and may be cited as the Long-Term
- 9 Care Consumer Financial Interest Prohibition Act.
- 10 Section 2. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 12 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 13 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- "Facility." Any of the following:
- 15 (1) A facility that provides "domiciliary care" as
- defined under section 2202-A of the act of April 9, 1929
- 17 (P.L.177, No.175), known as The Administrative Code of 1929.
- 18 (2) An "assisted living residence" as defined under

- 1 section 1001 of the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21),
- 2 known as the Human Services Code.
- 3 (3) A "personal care home" as defined under section 1001 4 of the Human Services Code.
- 5 (4) A "long-term care nursing facility" as defined under 6 section 802.1 of the act of July 19, 1979 (P.L.130, No.48),
- 7 known as the Health Care Facilities Act.
- 8 (5) A facility that provides "continuing care" as
- 9 defined under section 3 of the act of June 18, 1984 (P.L.391,
- 10 No.82), known as the Continuing-Care Provider Registration
- 11 and Disclosure Act.
- 12 (6) An "older adult daily living center" as defined
- 13 under section 2 of the act of July 11, 1990 (P.L.499,
- 14 No.118), known as the Older Adult Daily Living Centers
- 15 Licensing Act.
- 16 "Home and community-based provider." Any of the following:
- 17 (1) A "home care agency" as defined under section 802.1
- 18 of the Health Care Facilities Act.
- 19 (2) A "home health care agency" as defined under section
- 20 802.1 of the Health Care Facilities Act.
- 21 (3) A State-approved home and community-based waiver
- 22 provider that operates under a Medicaid home and community-
- 23 based waiver granted by the Centers for Medicaid and Medicare
- 24 Services to the Department of Human Services under the
- 25 authority of section 1915(c) of the Social Security Act (49
- 26 Stat. 620, 42 U.S.C. § 1396n (c)) and that provides long-term
- care to nursing-facility-eligible consumers in the consumers'
- homes or at locations in the community to assist consumers to
- 29 function as independently as possible.
- 30 "Long-term care." Assistance, service or other devices that

- 1 may be provided over an extended period of time and designed to
- 2 meet medical, personal and social needs associated with aging,
- 3 chronic disease or disability, acute illness or injury or
- 4 behavioral health problems that enable a person to live as
- 5 independently as possible.
- 6 "Long-term care consumer." An individual who receives
- 7 services from a long-term care provider.
- 8 "Long-term care provider" or "provider." A facility or a
- 9 home and community-based provider licensed, certified or
- 10 otherwise approved by the Commonwealth to provide long-term
- 11 care.
- 12 Section 3. Financial interest prohibition.
- No employee who is paid by a provider to provide long-term
- 14 care services to a long-term care consumer and no contract
- 15 employee who has direct contact with a long-term care consumer
- 16 or unsupervised access to the personal living quarters of a
- 17 long-term care consumer may:
- 18 (1) be appointed or act as guardian of a long-term care
- 19 consumer;
- 20 (2) serve as an agent under a power of attorney of a
- 21 long-term care consumer;
- 22 (3) be a beneficiary of an insurance policy or annuity
- of a long-term care consumer; or
- 24 (4) serve as an executor of the estate of a long-term
- 25 care consumer.
- 26 Section 4. Effective date.
- 27 This act shall take effect immediately.
