AN ACT

Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain 2 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial 3 schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the 4 laws relating thereto," providing for mascot transition 5 grants; and establishing the Mascot Grant Fund. 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an 10 11 article to read: 12 ARTICLE XXVI-L 13 MASCOT TRANSITION GRANTS 14 Section 2601-L. Definitions. 15 The following words and phrases when used in this article shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 16 17 context clearly indicates otherwise: "American Indian mascot." A name, symbol or image that 18 depicts or refers to an American Indian or Native American 19 tribe, individual, custom or tradition that is used as a public 20

- 1 <u>institution of higher education's or a school entity's mascot,</u>
- 2 <u>nickname</u>, logo, letterhead or team name.
- 3 <u>"Department." The Department of Education of the</u>
- 4 <u>Commonwealth</u>.
- 5 <u>"Eliqible institution." A school entity or public</u>
- 6 <u>institution of higher education which is approved by the</u>
- 7 <u>department for a mascot grant under this article.</u>
- 8 "Mascot grant." A monetary grant provided by the department
- 9 under this article.
- 10 "Public institution of higher education." A university
- 11 within the State System of Higher Education, a community college
- 12 or State-related university.
- 13 "School entity." A school district, charter school, cyber
- 14 charter school, private school, intermediate unit or area career
- 15 and technical school.
- 16 Section 2602-L. Mascot Grant Fund.
- 17 (a) Establishment. -- The Mascot Grant Fund is established
- 18 within the State Treasury to provide mascot grants to an
- 19 eligible institution.
- 20 (b) Money. -- The department shall make available \$1,000,000
- 21 of the department's appropriation from the General Assembly in a
- 22 fiscal year to be deposited into the Mascot Grant Fund for the
- 23 implementation of this article.
- 24 <u>Section 2603-L. Grant eligibility and amount of award.</u>
- 25 Beginning with the 2024-2025 school year, the department
- 26 shall allot a one-time mascot grant of up to \$20,000 to an
- 27 eligible institution which has an American Indian mascot as of
- 28 the effective date of this section and voluntarily discontinues
- 29 the use of the American Indian mascot on or after the effective
- 30 date of this section.

- 1 Section 2604-L. Use of grant money.
- 2 (a) General rule. -- A mascot grant shall be used for, or in
- 3 connection with, expenses incurred by an eligible institution to
- 4 offset the costs associated with the discontinued use of an
- 5 American Indian mascot, including:
- 6 (1) The purchase, design or renovation of new equipment
- 7 such as logos, signs and other branding, including banners
- 8 and letterhead, to remove the American Indian mascot.
- 9 <u>(2) The purchase or renovation of sports equipment,</u>
- 10 facilities, sport uniforms or other sports paraphernalia and
- 11 <u>branding at local sports facilities to remove the American</u>
- 12 <u>Indian mascot</u>.
- 13 <u>(3) The removal of American Indian mascots on an</u>
- eligible institution's property, including artistic
- representations on flooring, windows, engravings or other
- 16 <u>adaptations on buildings.</u>
- 17 (b) Regulations.--The department may promulgate regulations
- 18 governing the use of mascot grants.
- 19 Section 2605-L. Forfeiture.
- 20 An eligible institution which knowingly submits
- 21 misrepresentations or false statements with the intention of
- 22 fraudulently obtaining a mascot grant from the department shall
- 23 <u>be denied status as an eligible institution under this article.</u>
- 24 Section 2606-L. Application.
- 25 <u>To receive a mascot grant, an eligible institution must</u>
- 26 submit an application to the department that includes an
- 27 estimated cost of discontinuing the use of an American Indian
- 28 mascot. The department shall establish procedures and criteria
- 29 for awarding mascot grants that shall include:
- 30 (1) Other application requirements and the deadline for

- 1 <u>submission of a mascot grant application.</u>
- 2 (2) Criteria for prioritizing mascot grant applications
- 3 which focuses on the necessity of each project described in
- 4 the application and which has as the first priority an
- 5 <u>application that describes capital construction projects</u>
- 6 <u>deemed necessary by the department for the eligible</u>
- 7 <u>institution to discontinue use of the American Indian mascot.</u>
- 8 <u>(3) Provisions for multiple school entities to apply</u>
- 9 jointly for funds to replace similar mascots or jointly
- 10 <u>procure replacement property of branded items.</u>
- 11 <u>Section 2607-L. Research and assistance.</u>
- 12 The department may consult the Pennsylvania Human Relations
- 13 Commission, Office of Advocacy and Reform or other Commonwealth
- 14 agency for legal, administrative or cultural guidance to school
- 15 entities applying for mascot grants.
- 16 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
