AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
 - act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study,
- 6 providing for child abuse awareness and prevention.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 <u>Section 1529. Child Abuse Awareness and Prevention.--(a)</u>
- 13 Beginning with the 2021-2022 school year, each school entity
- 14 shall:
- 15 (1) Develop an age-appropriate child abuse awareness and
- 16 prevention education program and incorporate the program into
- 17 the school entity's existing curriculum for students in
- 18 <u>kindergarten through grade twelve. In developing the program,</u>
- 19 the school entity shall use the model curriculum developed by

- 1 the department under subsection (b) (1).
- 2 (2) Include training in child abuse awareness and prevention
- 3 in the professional development plan submitted by the school
- 4 entity to the secretary for approval under section 1205.1; which
- 5 shall provide four (4) hours of training every five (5) years
- 6 for professional educators assigned to teach courses into which
- 7 <u>child abuse awareness and prevention education has been</u>
- 8 incorporated under paragraph (1). Training under this paragraph
- 9 may be used to satisfy a professional educator's continuing
- 10 professional education requirement under section 1205.2. A
- 11 school entity shall use the materials made available by the
- 12 <u>department under subsection (b)(2) to conduct the training.</u>
- 13 (b) The department, in consultation with the Department of
- 14 <u>Human Services and at least one organization addressing child</u>
- 15 abuse, shall:
- 16 (1) Develop a model child abuse awareness and prevention
- 17 curriculum, which may include materials already publicly
- 18 available, and make the curriculum available to all school
- 19 entities and, upon request, to nonpublic schools.
- 20 (2) Compile, develop and post on its publicly accessible
- 21 Internet website recommended guidelines and educational
- 22 materials for the training provided for under subsection (a) (2),
- 23 which may include materials already publicly available.
- 24 (c) As used in this section, the following words and phrases
- 25 shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection unless
- 26 the context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 27 <u>"Department." The Department of Education of the</u>
- 28 Commonwealth.
- 29 "Nonpublic school." A nonprofit school, other than a school
- 30 entity, where a resident of this Commonwealth may legally

- 1 <u>fulfill the compulsory school attendance requirements of this</u>
- 2 act and which meets the requirements of Title VI of the Civil
- 3 Rights Act of 1964 (Public Law 88-352, 78 Stat. 241).
- 4 "Professional educator." As defined in section 1205.2(o).
- 5 <u>"School entity." A school district, joint school district,</u>
- 6 <u>charter school</u>, <u>regional charter school</u>, <u>cyber charter school</u>,
- 7 <u>intermediate unit or area vocational-technical school.</u>
- 8 <u>"Secretary." The Secretary of Education of the Commonwealth.</u>
- 9 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
