AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 3 (Agriculture) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated 2 Statutes, establishing the Pennsylvania Socially Diverse
- Statutes, establishing the Pennsylvania Socially Diverse Farmers Commission and providing for its powers and duties.
- 4 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 5 hereby enacts as follows:
- 6 Section 1. Part I of Title 3 of the Pennsylvania
- 7 Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a chapter to read:

- 2 § 1301. Scope of chapter.
- 3 This chapter relates to the Pennsylvania Socially Diverse
- 4 Farmers Commission.
- 5 § 1302. Definitions.
- 6 The following words and phrases when used in this chapter
- 7 shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- 8 context clearly indicates otherwise:
- 9 <u>"Commission." The Pennsylvania Socially Diverse Farmers</u>
- 10 Commission established in section 1303 (relating to
- 11 establishment).
- 12 "Economic justice area." A census block as reported in the
- 13 most recently completed Federal decennial census published by
- 14 the United States Census Bureau in which 20% or more of
- 15 individuals live at or below the Federal poverty line, or 30%
- 16 percent or more of the population identifies as a nonwhite
- 17 minority.
- 18 "Low-income or moderate-income community." A census block as
- 19 reported in the most recently completed Federal decennial census
- 20 published by the United States Census Bureau that has a poverty
- 21 rate of at least 20%, or in which the median family income does
- 22 not exceed 80% of the greater of the Statewide or metropolitan
- 23 median family income.
- "Socially disadvantaged farmer." A farmer who belongs to a
- 25 socially disadvantaged group.
- 26 <u>"Socially disadvantaged group." A group whose members have</u>
- 27 been subjected to racial, ethnic, sexual preference or gender
- 28 prejudice because of their identity as members of the group and
- 29 <u>without regard to their personal qualities.</u>
- 30 "Socially disadvantaged individual." As follows:

- 1 (1) An individual who has been subjected to racial or 2 ethnic prejudice or cultural bias within society because of 3 the individual's identity as a member of a group and without regard to the individual's personal qualities. 4 5 (2) The term includes an individual who is any of the 6 following: 7 (i) African American. 8 (ii) Native American. 9 (iii) Alaska Native. 10 (iv) Latin American. 11 (v) Asian American. 12 (vi) Pacific Islander. (vii) A member of the LGBTQ community. 13 (viii) A woman. 14 (ix) A member of a low-income or moderate-income 15 16 community or underserved community. (3) The social disadvantage under this definition must 17 18 stem from circumstances beyond the individual's control. 19 "Underserved community." A census block determined to be an area with low supermarket access by either the United States 20 21 Department of Agriculture as identified in the Food Access Research Atlas or through a methodology that has been adopted 22 23 for use by another governmental or philanthropic healthy food 24 initiative. § 1303. Establishment. 25 26 The Pennsylvania Socially Diverse Farmers Commission is 27 established.
- § 1304. Duties. 28
- 29 (a) Reviews and recommendations. -- The commission shall
- review and make recommendations to promote and implement a 30

- 1 diversity, equity and inclusion plan within the department aimed
- 2 <u>at improving opportunities for socially disadvantaged farmers</u>
- 3 and economic justice areas by incorporating the goal of
- 4 <u>eliminating disparities for socially disadvantaged groups in</u>
- 5 this Commonwealth. Reviews and recommendations shall be in the
- 6 <u>following areas:</u>
- 7 (1) Education and career opportunities for socially
- 8 <u>disadvantaged individuals, socially disadvantaged farmers and</u>
- 9 <u>socially disadvantaged groups.</u>
- 10 (2) Current issues facing socially disadvantaged
- 11 <u>farmers.</u>
- 12 (3) Grant awards and tax credit processes for socially
- disadvantaged farmers.
- 14 (4) Statutory impacts on socially disadvantaged farmers.
- 15 (5) Capital access for socially disadvantaged farmers.
- 16 (6) Land access for socially disadvantaged farmers.
- 17 (7) Local government impacts on socially disadvantaged
- 18 <u>farmers</u>.
- 19 (8) Diversity and inclusion training on farms, in retail
- food establishments and in the agriculture community,
- 21 including county fairs.
- 22 (9) Policies to improve agricultural education and
- 23 <u>career opportunities in economic justice areas.</u>
- 24 (10) Other areas identified by the commission.
- 25 (b) Additional powers and duties. -- The commission shall have
- 26 the following additional powers and duties:
- 27 (1) Review, make findings and offer recommendations
- 28 <u>related to the socially disadvantaged farmers in this</u>
- 29 Commonwealth.
- 30 (2) Consult with and utilize experts to assist the

Τ	commission in carrying out the duties under this subsection.
2	(3) Receive input from interested parties.
3	(4) Hold public hearings in different regions of this
4	Commonwealth. Virtual public hearings may be utilized by the
5	commission.
6	(5) Review and consider diversity, equity and inclusion
7	policies and factors utilized throughout farming in the
8	<u>United States.</u>
9	(6) Review the administration and operation of State and
10	regional programs and services and make recommendations to
11	implement new policies, statutes and regulations.
12	(7) Recommend proposed legislation and regulatory
13	changes based on the commission's findings.
14	(8) Not later than one year after the effective date of
15	this paragraph, issue a report of the commission's findings
16	and recommendations to the following:
17	(i) The Governor.
18	(ii) The President pro tempore of the Senate.
19	(iii) The Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the
20	Senate.
21	(iv) The Speaker of the House of Representatives.
22	(v) The Majority Leader and Minority Leader of the
23	House of Representatives.
24	(vi) The chairperson and minority chairperson of the
25	Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee of the Senate.
26	(vii) The chairperson and minority chairperson of
27	the Agriculture and Rural Affairs Committee of the House
28	of Representatives.
29	§ 1305. Membership.
30	(a) Members The commission shall consist of the following

1	members:
2	(1) Three individuals appointed by the Governor.
3	(2) The secretary or a designee.
4	(3) The Secretary of Community and Economic Development
5	or a designee.
6	(4) The Secretary of Environmental Protection or a
7	<u>designee.</u>
8	(5) The Secretary of Labor and Industry or a designee.
9	(6) The Secretary of Revenue or a designee.
10	(7) One individual appointed by the President pro
11	tempore of the Senate.
12	(8) One individual appointed by the Speaker of the House
13	of Representatives.
14	(9) One individual appointed by the Majority Leader of
15	the Senate.
16	(10) One individual appointed by the Majority Leader of
17	the House of Representatives.
18	(11) One individual appointed by the Minority Leader of
19	the Senate.
20	(12) One individual appointed by the Minority Leader of
21	the House of Representatives.
22	(13) A representative of the Pennsylvania Farm Bureau.
23	(14) A representative of PASA Sustainable Agriculture.
24	(15) A representative of The Pennsylvania State
25	University with expertise in diversity, equity and inclusion.
26	(16) A representative of Rodale Institute.
27	(17) Three representatives of urban agriculture
28	organizations, including representation from Philadelphia,

30 (18) A representative of a farm worker advocacy group or

Pittsburgh and one other municipality.

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- 1 <u>organization</u>.
- 2 (19) A member of the public representing youth.
- 3 (20) A representative of Minorities in Agriculture,
- 4 <u>Natural Resources, and Related Sciences (MANRRS).</u>
- 5 (b) Chairperson. -- The commission shall appoint a member, who
- 6 shall be from a socially disadvantaged group, to serve as
- 7 <u>chairperson of the commission.</u>
- 8 (c) Considerations. -- The following apply:
- 9 <u>(1) In making appointments, the Governor, the President</u>
- pro tempore of the Senate and the Speaker of the House of
- 11 Representatives shall consider and appoint residents of this
- 12 Commonwealth who:
- (i) have a knowledge of problems facing racial and
- ethnic populations in this Commonwealth;
- (ii) have experience in advocacy relating to racial
- and ethnic farming issues; and
- 17 (iii) provide leadership in programs or activities
- 18 that create and improve opportunities for racial and
- 19 ethnic populations.
- 20 (2) At least half of the appointments shall be from
- 21 socially disadvantaged groups as provided in paragraph (1),
- 22 with appointees from no fewer than five different socially
- 23 disadvantaged groups. If a commission is appointed which
- fails to meet this requirement, the secretary shall replace a
- 25 nonsocially disadvantaged appointment with a new appointment
- from an unrepresented socially disadvantaged group until the
- 27 requirement is fulfilled.
- 28 § 1306. Meetings.
- The commission shall hold its first meeting within 45 days of
- 30 the effective date of this section, regardless of whether all

- 1 <u>legislative caucuses have appointed members to the commission.</u>
- 2 The commission shall hold meetings at the call of the
- 3 chairperson on no fewer than six different dates.
- 4 § 1307. Payments to members.
- 5 <u>Members of the commission may not receive compensation for</u>
- 6 <u>services but shall be reimbursed for all necessary travel and</u>
- 7 other reasonable expenses incurred in connection with the
- 8 performance of the duties as members of the commission.
- 9 § 1308. Administrative support.
- 10 The department shall provide administrative support, meeting
- 11 space and any other assistance required by the commission to
- 12 carry out the commission's duties under this chapter. The
- 13 <u>department shall provide the commission with data, research and</u>
- 14 other information upon request by the commission.
- 15 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 30 days.
