Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in driving after imbibing alcohol or utilizing drugs, further providing for grading and for penalties. 3 4 This act may be referred to as Deana's Law. 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 6 hereby enacts as follows: 7 Section 1. Grading. * * * 10 11 (b) Other offenses. --* * * 12 An individual who violates section 3802(a)(1) 1.3 (4.1)14 where the individual refused testing of breath or chemical 15 testing pursuant to a valid search warrant, court order or 16 any other basis permissible by the Constitution of the United 17 States and the Constitution of Pennsylvania, or who violates 18 section 3802(c) or (d) [and who] commits:

- 1 <u>(i) A felony of the third degree if the individual</u>
- 2 has two [or more] prior offenses [commits a felony of the
- third degree].

- 11 (c.2) Consecutive sentence. -- A sentence imposed upon an
- 12 individual under this section who has two or more prior offenses
- 13 <u>shall be served consecutively to any other sentence the</u>
- 14 <u>individual is serving and to any other sentence being then</u>
- 15 imposed by the court, except for those with which the offense
- 16 <u>must merge as a matter of law.</u>
- 17 (c.3) Sentencing enhancement. -- The Pennsylvania Commission
- 18 on Sentencing, under 42 Pa.C.S. § 2154 (relating to adoption of
- 19 <u>guidelines for sentencing</u>), shall provide for a sentencing
- 20 enhancement for a violation of section 3802(a)(1) where the
- 21 individual refused testing of breath or chemical testing
- 22 pursuant to a valid search warrant, court order or any other
- 23 basis permissible by the Constitution of the United States and
- 24 the Constitution of Pennsylvania or for a violation of section
- 25 3802(c) or (d) and where the individual has four or more prior
- 26 offenses.
