17	their registration with the United States Drug Enforcement

19	required to register) and 828(b) (relating to order forms) and
20	<u>21 CFR 1301.51 (relating to modification in registration) to</u>

1	receive and destroy mail-back packages and to install, manage
2	and maintain collection receptacles for prescription drugs.
3	(11) To recommend that pharmacies modify their registration
4	with the United States Drug Enforcement Administration to
5	receive and destroy prescription drugs in accordance with
6	paragraph (10).

8	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
