WHITE MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A 5 PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 220 IN LYCOMING AND SULLIVAN COUNTIES AS THE LIEUTENANT COMMANDER JOHN J. PETERMAN MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; DESIGNATING A PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 220 IN LYCOMING COUNTY AS THE THOMAS A. PATERNOSTRO MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; 9 DESIGNATING A BRIDGE ON THAT PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 74 OVER 10 THE SHERMAN'S CREEK, SPRING TOWNSHIP, PERRY COUNTY, AS THE 11 PFC WILLIAM OSCAR STAMBAUGH MEMORIAL BRIDGE; DESIGNATING A PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 309 IN UPPER SAUCON TOWNSHIP, LEHIGH 13 COUNTY, AS THE OFFICER DAVID M. PETZOLD MEMORIAL HIGHWAY; 14 15 DESIGNATING THE PEDESTRIAN WALKWAYS ON THE MATSONFORD BRIDGE, LOCATED ON STATE ROUTE 3016 OVER THE SCHUYLKILL RIVER, 16 CONNECTING THE BOROUGHS OF WEST CONSHOHOCKEN AND 17 CONSHOHOCKEN, MONTGOMERY COUNTY, AS THE CLAY-DOC WALK IN 18 MEMORY OF WEST CONSHOHOCKEN BOROUGH POLICE CHIEF JOSEPH G. 19 CLAYBORNE III AND CONSHOHOCKEN BOROUGH POLICE CHIEF JAMES H. 20 21 DOUGHERTY, SR.; AND DESIGNATING A PORTION OF STATE ROUTE 1030 22 IN THE BOROUGH OF DONORA, WASHINGTON COUNTY, AS THE KEN GRIFFEY SR. & JR. DRIVE. 23

24 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania

- 1 hereby enacts as follows:
- 2 Section 1. Marine Lance Corporal Gary Lee Ream Memorial
- 3 Highway.
- 4 (a) Findings. -- The General Assembly finds and declares as
- 5 follows:
- 6 (1) Gary Lee Ream was born July 25, 1945, in Carlisle,
- 7 Pennsylvania.
- 8 (2) Lance Corporal Ream attended Carlisle Area High
- 9 School and, after graduating, entered the United States
- 10 Marine Corps in October 1964, where he served two years.
- 11 (3) Lance Corporal Ream was stationed in the Quang Nam
- 12 Province in the Republic of Vietnam as part of the 1st
- 13 Platoon, C Company, 1st Battalion, 1st Marine Regiment, 1st
- 14 Marine Division.
- 15 (4) Lance Corporal Ream died November 3, 1966, at 20
- years of age while serving as point man of a combat patrol
- 17 near Hoi An, Republic of Vietnam, where he and his squad were
- 18 caught in an enemy ambush in which he was hit by enemy rifle
- 19 and machine gun fire.
- 20 (5) Lance Corporal Ream was awarded the Purple Heart,
- 21 the Combat Action Ribbon, the Navy Presidential Unit Citation
- 22 ribbon with one bronze star, the National Defense Service
- 23 Medal, the Vietnam Service Medal with one bronze star, the
- 24 Republic of Vietnam Meritorious Unit Citation with Gallantry
- 25 Cross, the Republic of Vietnam Meritorious Unit Citation
- 26 Civil Action Ribbon with Palm and the Vietnam Campaign Medal
- with 1960 device awarded to family, not to soldier, in honor
- of his service to his country.
- 29 (6) Lance Corporal Ream, son of Wallace R. Ream Sr. and
- 30 Lois C. Ream as well as brother to five siblings, was

- 1 selflessly serving our country at the time of his death. His
- 2 actions exemplified the honor, courage and duty to country
- 3 associated with a member of the United States Marine Corps.
- 4 (b) Designation.--The section of State Route 74 in
- 5 Cumberland County from the eastern corporate limits of Carlisle
- 6 Borough to the intersection of State Route 74 with Ashland
- 7 Avenue is hereby designated the Marine Lance Corporal Gary Lee
- 8 Ream Memorial Highway.
- 9 (c) Signs.--The Department of Transportation shall erect and
- 10 maintain appropriate signs displaying the name of the highway to

- 12 SECTION 2. LIEUTENANT ANDREW J. WHITE MEMORIAL BRIDGE.
- 13 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
- 14 FOLLOWS:
- 15 (1) LIEUTENANT ANDREW J. WHITE WAS A 12-YEAR VETERAN OF
- 16 THE FIRE SERVICE. HE CAME FROM A FAMILY OF FIREFIGHTERS,
- 17 STARTING HIS CAREER IN THE FIRE SERVICE AT 14 YEARS OF AGE
- 18 WHEN HE WAS INDUCTED INTO THE ROCKY GROVE VOLUNTEER FIRE
- 19 DEPARTMENT AS A JUNIOR FIREFIGHTER. AT 16 YEARS OF AGE HE
- 20 BECAME AN ACTIVE FIREFIGHTER AND REGULAR MEMBER OF THE ROCKY
- 21 GROVE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT.
- 22 (2) LT. WHITE PARTICIPATED IN TRAINING AND PROGRESSED
- 23 THROUGH THE ROCKY GROVE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT. HE LATER
- 24 BECAME AN EMERGENCY MEDICAL TECHNICIAN AND SERVED AS
- LIEUTENANT OF ROCKY GROVE'S STATION #2 FROM 1999 TO 2001.
- 26 (3) LT. WHITE WAS KILLED IN THE LINE OF DUTY ON JANUARY
- 27 11, 2001, WHILE FIGHTING A STRUCTURE FIRE WITH THE ROCKY
- 28 GROVE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT.
- 29 (4) LT. WHITE LIVED IN THE SUGARCREEK AREA HIS ENTIRE
- 30 LIFE. THE SUGARCREEK BRIDGE IS WITHIN ONE-HALF MILE OF WHERE

- 1 HE RESIDED, AND HE HAD TRAVERSED THIS BRIDGE COUNTLESS TIMES
- 2 WHEN RESPONDING TO CALLS DURING HIS SERVICE WITH THE ROCKY
- 3 GROVE VOLUNTEER FIRE DEPARTMENT.
- 4 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE BRIDGE LOCATED ON THAT PORTION OF
- 5 STATE ROUTE 4010 OVER SUGAR CREEK, SUGARCREEK BOROUGH, VENANGO
- 6 COUNTY, COMMONLY KNOWN AS THE SUGARCREEK BRIDGE OR TWIN BRIDGES,
- 7 IS HEREBY DESIGNATED THE LIEUTENANT ANDREW J. WHITE MEMORIAL
- 8 BRIDGE.
- 9 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 10 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE BRIDGE TO
- 11 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE BRIDGE.
- 12 SECTION 3. LIEUTENANT COMMANDER JOHN J. PETERMAN MEMORIAL
- 13 HIGHWAY.
- 14 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AND DECLARES AS
- 15 FOLLOWS:
- 16 (1) LIEUTENANT COMMANDER JOHN J. PETERMAN WAS BORN IN
- 17 NORDMONT, SULLIVAN COUNTY, ON JANUARY 19, 1923, AND IN 1941,
- 18 GRADUATED FROM SULLIVAN HIGHLANDS SCHOOL, SONESTOWN. HE
- 19 ENLISTED IN THE UNITED STATES NAVY 11 DAYS AFTER GRADUATION.
- 20 (2) LIEUTENANT COMMANDER PETERMAN SPENT THE EARLY YEARS
- 21 OF HIS SERVICE IN THE NAVY ASSIGNED TO SUBMARINES. LIEUTENANT
- 22 COMMANDER PETERMAN WAS INITIALLY ASSIGNED TO THE USS FLYING
- 23 FISH (SS229). WHILE ABROAD, LIEUTENANT COMMANDER PETERMAN
- 24 MADE NINE WAR PATROLS, HAVING A PART IN THE BATTLE OF MIDWAY,
- 25 PATROLLING THE TRUK LAGOON OFF THE CAROLINE ISLANDS AND
- 26 PATROLLING IN THE SEA OF JAPAN.
- 27 (3) AFTER SERVING ABOARD SUBMARINES FOR 11 YEARS,
- 28 LIEUTENANT COMMANDER PETERMAN SERVED AS A TORPEDO INSTRUCTOR.
- 29 IN 1955, LIEUTENANT COMMANDER PETERMAN BECAME A COMMISSIONED
- 30 OFFICER, SERVING AT AMMUNITION DEPOTS IN NEW JERSEY AND

- 1 CALIFORNIA. HE ALSO SPENT TIME ON THE USS HENRICO (APA45) AS
- 2 A GUNNERY OFFICER AND THEN ON THE USS SPERRY (AS12) AS A
- 3 WEAPONS REPAIR OFFICER. HE SERVED THE LAST FIVE YEARS OF HIS
- 4 NAVY CAREER AS AN UNDERWATER WEAPONS OFFICER IN NEWPORT,
- 5 RHODE ISLAND. UPON RETIRING IN 1972 AS A LIEUTENANT
- 6 COMMANDER, HE RETURNED HOME TO HIS NATIVE SULLIVAN COUNTY,
- 7 WHERE HE SERVED A TERM AS COUNTY SHERIFF, AND AS A LAPORTE
- 8 TOWNSHIP SUPERVISOR.
- 9 (4) LIEUTENANT COMMANDER PETERMAN WAS ACTIVE IN HIS
- 10 COMMUNITY WHERE, AS A MEMBER OF THE WILLIAMSPORT BASE OF THE
- 11 UNITED STATES SUBMARINE VETERANS, INC., HE PARTICIPATED IN
- 12 VISITS TO THE JANET WEIS CHILDREN'S HOSPITAL, VISITING WITH
- 13 PEDIATRIC PATIENTS WHILE MAKING THEM "HONORARY SUBMARINERS."
- 14 LIEUTENANT COMMANDER PETERMAN WOULD WEAR HIS UNIFORM FOR
- 15 THESE VISITS, OFTEN GIVING THE CHILDREN A LIVING HISTORY
- 16 LESSON. LIEUTENANT COMMANDER PETERMAN WAS ALSO AN ACTIVE
- 17 MEMBER OF THE SONESTOWN AMERICAN LEGION POST #601.
- 18 (B) DESIGNATION.--THE SECTION OF STATE ROUTE 220 FROM STATE
- 19 ROUTE 405 IN HUGHESVILLE BOROUGH, LYCOMING COUNTY, TO STATE
- 20 ROUTE 42 IN LAPORTE TOWNSHIP, SULLIVAN COUNTY, IS HEREBY
- 21 DESIGNATED AS THE LIEUTENANT COMMANDER JOHN J. PETERMAN MEMORIAL
- 22 HIGHWAY.
- 23 (C) SIGNS.--THE DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION SHALL ERECT AND
- 24 MAINTAIN APPROPRIATE SIGNS DISPLAYING THE NAME OF THE HIGHWAY TO
- 25 TRAFFIC IN BOTH DIRECTIONS ON THE HIGHWAY.
- 26 SECTION 4. THOMAS A. PATERNOSTRO MEMORIAL HIGHWAY.
- 27 (A) FINDINGS.--THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY FINDS AS FOLLOWS:
- 28 (1) THOMAS A. PATERNOSTRO WAS BORN IN WILLIAMSPORT ON
- 29 AUGUST 9, 1939. HE WAS MARRIED TO MARTHALIE RYAN PATERNOSTRO
- 30 FOR OVER 48 YEARS. HE WAS A 1957 GRADUATE OF THE FORMER ST.

- 1 MARY'S HIGH SCHOOL IN WILLIAMSPORT. HE WAS A 1964 GRADUATE OF
- 2 LYCOMING COLLEGE WHERE HE RECEIVED A BACHELOR OF ARTS DEGREE
- 3 IN POLITICAL SCIENCE. IN 1975, HE RECEIVED HIS MASTERS OF
- 4 PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION FROM ST. LAWRENCE UNIVERSITY IN CANTON,
- 5 NEW YORK.
- 6 (2) MR. PATERNOSTRO WAS A LIFELONG EDUCATOR. HE WAS BOTH
- 7 AN ELEMENTARY AND SECONDARY SCHOOL TEACHER BEFORE SERVING AS
- 8 AN ELEMENTARY PRINCIPAL IN PRATTSBURGH, NEW YORK. HE THEN
- 9 SERVED AS SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS IN THE CLIFTON-FINE
- 10 SCHOOL DISTRICT IN STAR LAKE, NEW YORK AND THE ONEONTA CITY
- 11 SCHOOL DISTRICT IN ONEONTA, NEW YORK. IN 1981, HE BECAME
- 12 SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS AT THE EAST LYCOMING SCHOOL
- 13 DISTRICT IN HUGHESVILLE, WHERE HE SERVED ADMIRABLY FOR 11
- 14 YEARS.
- 15 (3) FOLLOWING HIS RETIREMENT FROM PUBLIC SCHOOLS IN
- 16 1992, MR. PATERNOSTRO WENT TO WORK FOR THE INDUSTRIAL
- 17 MODERNIZATION CENTER IN MONTOURSVILLE. THERE HE WAS A DRIVING
- 18 FORCE BEHIND THE PENNSYLVANIA SCHOOL-TO-WORK INITIATIVE, A
- 19 PROJECT THAT ULTIMATELY BECAME A NATIONAL MODEL FOR YOUTH
- 20 APPRENTICESHIP. HE TESTIFIED ABOUT THIS INITIATIVE IN FRONT
- 21 OF A UNITED STATES SENATE COMMITTEE. HIS TESTIMONY AND THE
- 22 INITIATIVE WERE LATER FEATURED ON THE ABC NEWS AMERICAN
- 23 AGENDA AND IN SMITHSONIAN MAGAZINE.
- 24 (4) CONTINUING HIS DEDICATED SERVICE TO PUBLIC EDUCATION
- 25 AND CHILDREN, MR. PATERNOSTRO SERVED AS THE DIRECTOR OF THE
- 26 CHILDREN'S ADVOCACY INITIATIVE FOR LYCOMING COUNTY IN THE
- 27 EARLY 2000S. IN 2004, HE RECEIVED THE CHILD ADVOCATE AWARD
- 28 FOR LEADERSHIP ON CHILDREN'S ISSUES.
- 29 (5) MR. PATERNOSTRO SPENT TIME SUPERVISING STUDENT
- TEACHERS AT BLOOMSBURG UNIVERSITY. HE ALSO SPENT THREE YEARS

- AS A CONSULTANT FOR THE AMERICAN BOARD FOR THE CERTIFICATION

  OF TEACHER EXCELLENCE IN WASHINGTON, DC.
- 3 (6) FROM 2005 TO 2011, FOLLOWING AN APPOINTMENT BY THE
  4 PENNSYLVANIA SECRETARY OF EDUCATION, MR. PATERNOSTRO SERVED
  5 AS ONE OF THE COMMONWEALTH'S FIRST DISTINGUISHED EDUCATORS,
  6 INDIVIDUALS SERVING TO HELP STRUGGLING DISTRICTS THROUGHOUT
- 7 THE STATE IMPROVE STUDENT ACHIEVEMENT.

AND A LEADERSHIP LYCOMING VOLUNTEER.

- 8 (7) MR. PATERNOSTRO WAS AN ACTIVE MEMBER OF HIS 9 COMMUNITY. - 20 (4) PFC STAMBAUGH SERVED WITH COMPANY H 126 INFANTRY,
- 21 2ND BATTALION, 32ND INFANTRY DIVISION (RED ARROWMEN).
- 22 (5) PFC STAMBAUGH WAS KILLED IN COMBAT ON NOVEMBER 27,
- 23 1942, WHILE SERVING IN THE INFANTRY IN BUNA, NEW GUINEA.
- 24 (6) PFC STAMBAUGH WAS POSTHUMOUSLY AWARDED THE PURPLE

- 9 UPPER SAUCON'S FIRST DETECTIVE IN 2001. WHILE ASSIGNED AS A
- 10 DETECTIVE, OFFICER PETZOLD EARNED A BACHELOR OF ARTS DEGREE
- 11 WITH A MAJOR IN CRIMINAL JUSTICE FROM DESALES UNIVERSITY.
- 12 (2) IN MAY 2005, OFFICER PETZOLD JOINED THE FEDERAL
