AN ACT

Amending the act of May 1, 1933 (P.L.216, No.76), entitled "An act relating to dentistry; defining and providing for the 2 licensing and registration of dentists and dental hygienists, 3 and for the revocation and suspension of such licenses and registrations, subject to appeal, and for their 5 reinstatement; defining the powers and duties of the State 6 Dental Council and Examining Board and the Department of 7 Public Instruction; providing penalties; and repealing 8 existing laws," further providing for dental technicians and 9 10 prescriptions. The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 11 12 hereby enacts as follows: 1.3 Section 1. Section 11.1(b) and (d) of the act of May 1, 1933 14 (P.L.216, No.76), known as The Dental Law, are amended to read: 15 Section 11.1. Dental Technicians; Prescriptions. -- * * * Any dentist who uses the services of a dental technician 16 17 [in this State] shall furnish [him] the dental technician with a written prescription, based upon a physical examination of the 18 19 patient's oral health conducted by the prescribing dentist, on 20 forms prescribed by the board, which shall contain: (1) the name and address of the dental technician; (2) The patient's name or 21 22 identification number. If a number is used the patient's name

- 1 shall be written upon the duplicate copy of the prescription
- 2 retained by the dentist; (3) The date on which the prescription
- 3 was written; (4) A prescription of the work to be done, with
- 4 diagrams if necessary; (5) A specification of the type and
- 5 quality of materials to be used; (6) The signature of the
- 6 dentist and his license number.
- 7 The dental technician shall retain the original prescription,
- 8 and the dentist shall retain a duplicate copy thereof for
- 9 inspection by the board or its agent for a period of two years.

- 11 (d) It shall be unlawful for any dental technician to
- 12 furnish services to any [dentist] person without first obtaining
- 13 a prescription therefor from [him] a dentist, or to fail to
- 14 retain the original prescription for two years, or to refuse to
- 15 allow the board or its agent to inspect his files.

- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
