## AN ACT

1 2 3 4 5	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," providing for online instruction.
6	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
7	hereby enacts as follows:
8	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
9	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding an
10	article to read:
11	<u>ARTICLE XV-K</u>
12	ONLINE INSTRUCTION
13	<u>Section 1501-K. Definitions.</u>
14	The following words and phrases when used in this article
15	shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
16	context clearly indicates otherwise:
16 17	<u>context clearly indicates otherwise:</u> <u>"Acute poverty household." A household in which the ratio of</u>

2	"Department." The Department of Education of the
3	Commonwealth.
4	"Distance learning or remote learning." Curriculum that:
5	(1) is provided by a student's home school entity to
6	supplement or supplant all or part of in-person learning; and
7	(2) can be accessed anywhere, synchronously or
8	asynchronously, by the Internet.
9	"Fund." The School Online Equity Fund established under
10	section 1504-K.
11	"Online instruction." Distance learning or remote learning,
12	or a cyber school program provided by a student's home school
13	entity or a contracted third party, or any combination thereof,
14	with or without in-person instruction, which can be assessed
15	anywhere, synchronously or asynchronously, by the Internet.
16	"School entity." A school district, intermediate unit, area
17	career and technical school, charter school, cyber charter
18	school or regional charter school that a child attends in order
19	to fulfill the compulsory attendance requirements of this act.
20	"Technology equipment." Includes laptops, tablets and other
21	electronic mobile devices that can access online instruction.
22	"Technology infrastructure." As follows:
23	(1) Technology that allows technology equipment
24	necessary to access the Internet for online instruction.
25	(2) The term includes mobile hotspots.
26	Section 1502-K. Access to online instruction.
27	<u>(a) Duty of school entity generallyA school entity shall</u>
28	ensure that all enrolled students of the school entity have the
29	option of accessing online instruction or that online
30	instruction is available to all students if in-person
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1 <u>instruction is not possible.</u>

2	(b) Specific actionsTo fulfill the duty under subsection
3	(a), the school entity shall:
4	(1) Survey students and families annually as to their
5	ability to access technology equipment and technology
6	infrastructure from home.
7	(2) Require lesson plans, individualized education
8	programs and service agreements under section 504 of the
9	Rehabilitation Act of 1973 (Public Law 93-112, 29 U.S.C. §
10	794) and 22 Pa. Code Ch. 15 (relating to protected
11	handicapped students) to be designed for online instruction.
12	(3) Conduct training for online instruction for
13	students, parents and staff.
14	(4) Identify all students living in an acute poverty
15	household and lacking the technology equipment or technology
16	infrastructure, or both, to allow for online instruction,
17	and:
18	(i) Submit a grant request through the fund to
19	address the unmet needs relating to technology equipment
20	or technology infrastructure. The following apply:
21	(A) Technology equipment or technology
22	infrastructure obtained through this section remains
23	the property of the school entity.
24	(B) The school entity shall adopt appropriate
25	guidelines for the use and disbursement of the
26	technology equipment and technology infrastructure,
27	including matters relating to rotation schedules,
28	maintenance schedules and repair or replacement
29	policies due to accidental damage.
30	(ii) Connect a family of a student in need of

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1	technology equipment or technology infrastructures with
2	the school entity's contracted Internet service provider
3	to secure access for the student to the Internet at the
4	student's home at no cost.
5	Section 1503-K. Survey of school online instruction
6	preparedness.
7	(a) DevelopmentNot later than 45 days after the effective
8	date of this section, the department shall adopt a survey
9	instrument to measure online instruction preparedness and
10	training and curriculum readiness. The following apply:
11	(1) The survey shall then be distributed to all school
12	<u>entities.</u>
13	(2) The survey shall include the following:
14	(i) Student access at home to technology equipment
15	and technology infrastructure needed to participate in
16	online instruction.
17	(ii) Teachers and staff involved in providing or
18	assisting in instruction or student services and
19	accessibility to technology equipment and technology
20	infrastructure needed to participate in online
21	instruction.
22	(iii) Any additional hardware or software needed to
23	assist students with an individualized education program
24	in completing goals while participating in online
25	instruction.
26	(iv) Certification of a teacher and staff training
27	program in utilizing technology equipment and technology
28	infrastructure needed to conduct online instruction. All
29	teachers and related staff shall participate in this
30	training, which:

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1	(A) shall occur not later than September 15
2	annually; and
3	(B) may be used to comply with applicable State
4	continuing education requirements.
5	(v) Certification of a parent training program in
6	utilizing technology equipment and technology
7	infrastructure needed to assist in online instruction
8	that was publicly advertised with at least 21 days
9	notice. This training shall be offered not later than
10	<u>September 15 annually.</u>
11	(vi) Certification of a student training program
12	that is age appropriate and developmentally appropriate,
13	in utilizing technology equipment and technology
14	infrastructure needed to participate in online
15	instruction remotely. This training shall occur not later
16	than September 15 annually.
17	(vii) Certification that school policy requires that
18	lesson plans for each program of instruction offered by
19	the school entity shall be designed in consideration of
20	possible online instruction.
21	(b) CompletionNot later than 75 days after receipt of the
22	survey or September 21 in each subsequent year following the
23	effective date of this section, whichever is later, each school
24	entity shall return the completed survey prescribed under
25	subsection (a) to the department with the following tabulation:
26	(1) The number of enrolled students living in an acute
27	poverty percentage household without access to technology
28	equipment needed to participate in online instruction.
29	(2) The number of enrolled students living in an acute
30	poverty percentage household without access to technology

1	infrastructure needed to participate in online instruction.
2	(c) EngagementA survey shall not be deemed complete by
3	the department without:
4	(1) completing the specified certifications;
5	(2) receiving 90% parent participation and 100% staff
6	participation regarding technology-related responses; and
7	(3) providing to the department the number of students
8	from households living in acute poverty with technology
9	equipment and technology infrastructure needs.
10	(d) Frequency
11	(1) Training programs for teachers, staff, parents and
12	students shall be completed annually.
13	(2) Students admitted during the school year shall be
14	surveyed upon admittance.
15	(3) A school entity shall administer the survey
16	instrument at a minimum of every two years.
17	Section 1504-K. School Online Equity Fund.
18	(a) EstablishmentThe School Online Equity Fund is
19	established as a special nonlapsing fund in the State Treasury.
20	(b) PurposeThe fund shall provide grants to school
21	entities to ensure that students from households living in acute
22	poverty are provided the technology equipment and technology
23	infrastructure needed to participate in online instruction.
24	(c) Use of moneyAll money deposited in the fund and the
25	interest the money accrues is appropriated to the department on
26	a continuing basis to fund school entities under this article.
27	(d) Administrative action
28	(1) No administrative action shall prevent the deposit
29	of money in the fund in the fiscal year in which the money is
30	received.

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1	(2) The fund may only be used for funding authorized
2	under this article.
3	(3) Money in the fund may not be transferred or diverted
4	to any other purpose by administrative action.
5	(e) Source of moneyMoney available to the fund shall
6	include appropriations, executive authorizations and transfers
7	from the General Fund, special funds, Federal funds and other
8	sources of revenue made available to the fund.
9	(f) Amount of grantsFor the school year immediately
10	following the effective date of this section and each subsequent
11	school year, the Commonwealth shall make available to each
12	school entity that complies with section 1503-K a grant to be
13	calculated as follows:
14	(1) Using a completed survey under section 1503-K(a),
15	determine the sum of the following:
16	(i) The school entity's total number of enrolled
17	students living in an acute poverty household without
18	access to technology equipment.
19	(ii) The school entity's total number of enrolled
20	students living in an acute poverty household without
21	access to technology infrastructure.
22	(2) Divide the sum in paragraph (1) by the sum of the
23	following:
24	(i) The total number of enrolled students living in
25	an acute poverty household without access to technology
26	equipment for all school entities in this Commonwealth.
27	(ii) The total number of enrolled students living in
28	an acute poverty household without access to technology
29	infrastructure for all school entities in this
30	Commonwealth.

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1	(3) Multiply the quotient in paragraph (2) by the amount
2	available in the fund.
3	(g) Eligible uses of fund moneyGrant money received by a
4	school entity under this section may only be used:
5	(1) to assist students living in acute poverty
6	households for the purchase by the school entity of
7	technology equipment or technology infrastructure for a
8	student to participate in online instruction or purchase any
9	other hardware or software for a student with an
10	individualized education program that assists in completing
11	individualized education program goals while participating in
12	online instruction; and
13	(2) equally for each student who qualifies but may be
14	combined with additional school entity funding as long as it
15	is for a qualified item under this section. A household with
16	multiple eligible students shall not be limited for
17	technology equipment expenses but may be limited for
18	technology infrastructure expenses.
19	(h) ConstructionNothing in this section shall be
20	construed to limit a school entity from applying for additional
21	funding during the school year.
22	(i) Unspent moneyAll unspent fund money shall be returned
23	at the end of the school year to the department.
24	(j) Record keepingA school entity shall keep records
25	detailing each grant received and related expenditures under
26	this section.
27	Section 1505-K. Access to Internet.
28	(a) DutyAn Internet service provider that is contracted
29	by a school entity to provide Internet services shall establish
30	an Internet service and data package for students from
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1	households living in acute poverty in that school entity and
2	provide the package to those qualified applicants at no cost.
3	(b) LimitsReasonable limits may be placed on the Internet
4	service and data package under this section, including data
5	limits, access to noneducational websites and connection speed,
6	if the limits are suitable to the school entity's online
7	instruction requirements.
8	(c) Materials and informationA school entity shall work
9	with a contracted Internet service provider to develop materials
10	and an application process for qualified applicants and ensure
11	that information regarding this article is shared and easily
12	accessed by parents and guardians of children in the school
13	entity.
14
