## AN ACT

1	Amending the act of April 12, 1951 (P.L.90, No.21), entitled "An
2	act relating to alcoholic liquors, alcohol and malt and
3	brewed beverages; amending, revising, consolidating and
4	changing the laws relating thereto; regulating and
5	restricting the manufacture, purchase, sale, possession,
6	consumption, importation, transportation, furnishing, holding
7	in bond, holding in storage, traffic in and use of alcoholic
8	liquors, alcohol and malt and brewed beverages and the
9	persons engaged or employed therein; defining the powers and
10	duties of the Pennsylvania Liquor Control Board; providing
11	for the establishment and operation of State liquor stores,
12	for the payment of certain license fees to the respective
13	municipalities and townships, for the abatement of certain
14	nuisances and, in certain cases, for search and seizure
15	without warrant; prescribing penalties and forfeitures;
16	providing for local option, and repealing existing laws, " in
17	preliminary provisions, further providing for definitions.

"Eligible entity" [shall mean a city of the third class, a 2 3 hospital, a church, a synagogue, a volunteer fire company, a volunteer ambulance company, a volunteer rescue squad, a unit of 4 a nationally chartered club which has been issued a club liquor 5 license, a club which has been issued a club liquor license and 6 7 which, as of December 31, 2002, has been in existence for at 8 least 100 years, a library, a nationally accredited Pennsylvania 9 nonprofit zoological institution licensed by the United States 10 Department of Agriculture, a nonprofit agricultural association in existence for at least ten years, a bona fide sportsmen's 11 club in existence for at least ten years, a nationally chartered 12 13 veterans' organization and any affiliated lodge or subdivision 14 of such organization, a fraternal benefit society that is licensed to do business in this Commonwealth and any affiliated 15 16 lodge or subdivision of such fraternal benefit society, any nationally recognized community-based voluntary health 17 18 organization committed to fighting cancer, which has been in 19 existence for at least 100 years, a museum operated by a 20 nonprofit corporation, a nonprofit corporation engaged in the performing arts, an arts council, a nonprofit corporation that 21 operates an arts facility or museum, a nonprofit organization as 22 23 defined under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 24 1986 (Public Law 99-514, 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3)) whose purpose is 25 to protect the architectural heritage of a municipality and which has been recognized as such by a resolution of the 26 27 municipality, a nonprofit organization as defined under section 28 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (Public Law 99-29 514, 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3)) conducting a regatta in a city of 30 the second class with the permit to be used on State park

1 grounds or conducting a family-oriented celebration as part of 2 Welcome America in a city of the first class on property leased 3 from that city for more than fifty years, a nonprofit organization as defined under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal 4 Revenue Code of 1986 (26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3)) whose purpose is to 5 6 raise funds for the research and treatment of cystic fibrosis, a 7 nonprofit organization as defined under section 501(c)(3) of the 8 Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3)) whose purpose is to educate the public on issues dealing with 9 10 watershed conservation, a nonprofit organization as defined under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 11 (Public Law 99-514, 26 U.S.C. § 501(c)(3)) whose purpose is to 12 13 provide equine assisted activities for children and adults with 14 special needs, a nonprofit economic development agency in a city of the second class with the primary function to serve as an 15 16 economic generator for the greater southwestern Pennsylvania region by attracting and supporting film, television and related 17 18 media industry projects and coordinating government and business 19 offices in support of a production, a county tourist promotion 20 agency as defined in section 2 of the act of July 4, 2008 (P.L.621, No.50), known as the "Tourism Promotion Act," a junior 21 league that is a nonprofit organization as defined under section 22 23 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (26 U.S.C. § 24 501(c)(3)) that is comprised of women whose purpose is 25 exclusively educational and charitable in promoting the 26 volunteerism of women and developing and participating in 27 community projects and that has been in existence for over 28 seventy years, a nonprofit organization as defined under section 29 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 and whose purpose is the education and promotion of American history, a nonprofit 30
