AN ACT

Amending the act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), entitled "An act relating to insurance; amending, revising, and 2 consolidating the law providing for the incorporation of 3 insurance companies, and the regulation, supervision, and protection of home and foreign insurance companies, Lloyds associations, reciprocal and inter-insurance exchanges, and fire insurance rating bureaus, and the regulation and 7 supervision of insurance carried by such companies, 8 9 associations, and exchanges, including insurance carried by the State Workmen's Insurance Fund; providing penalties; and 10 repealing existing laws," in casualty insurance, providing 11 for coverage of medication assisted treatment. 12 13 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 14 hereby enacts as follows: 15 Section 1. The act of May 17, 1921 (P.L.682, No.284), known 16 as The Insurance Company Law of 1921, is amended by adding a 17 section to read: 18 Section 635.9. Coverage of Medication Assisted Treatment .--19 (a) A health insurance policy or government program that is 20 offered, issued or renewed in this Commonwealth shall provide coverage for MAT, including coverage for counseling and 21 behavioral therapies and any fees related to the provision of 22

- 1 MAT.
- 2 (b) The use of prior authorization for the approval of MAT
- 3 is prohibited, including prior authorization used for approval
- 4 <u>of MAT in a health insurance policy or government program that</u>
- 5 is issued or renewed in this Commonwealth.
- 6 (c) The following words and phrases when used in this
- 7 <u>section shall have the meanings given to them in this subsection</u>
- 8 <u>unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:</u>
- 9 "Controlled substance." As defined in section 2 of the act
- 10 of April 14, 1972 (P.L.233, No.64), known as "The Controlled
- 11 <u>Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic Act."</u>
- 12 "Drug." As defined in section 2 of "The Controlled
- 13 <u>Substance</u>, <u>Drug</u>, <u>Device</u> and <u>Cosmetic Act."</u>
- "Government program." The term includes:
- 15 (1) The Commonwealth's medical assistance program
- 16 established under the act of June 13, 1967 (P.L.31, No.21),
- 17 known as the "Human Services Code."
- 18 (2) The Children's Health Insurance Program.
- 19 "Health insurance policy." As defined in 40 Pa.C.S. § 9103
- 20 <u>(relating to definitions).</u>
- 21 "Medication assisted treatment" or "MAT." The use of
- 22 medication, approved by the United States Food and Drug
- 23 Administration, in combination with counseling and behavioral
- 24 therapies to treat a substance use disorder.
- 25 "Substance use disorder." A chronic, relapsing medical
- 26 illness characterized by:
- 27 (1) recurrent use of a drug or controlled substance despite
- 28 harmful consequences;
- 29 (2) long-lasting changes in brain chemistry;
- 30 (3) clinically significant impairment, including physical or

- 1 mental health problems or disability; or
- 2 <u>(4) the inability or failure to meet the demands of and</u>
- 3 <u>responsibilities at work, school or home.</u>
- 4 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
