AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in general provisions, further providing for 2 definitions; in financial responsibility, providing for 3 utility terrain vehicles; in special vehicles and pedestrians, providing for operation of utility terrain 5 vehicles; in miscellaneous provisions, further providing for 6 off-road vehicles in urban municipalities; and imposing 7 penalties. 8 9 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania hereby enacts as follows: 10 11 Section 1. Section 102 of Title 75 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is amended by adding a definition to read: 12 13 § 102. Definitions. Subject to additional definitions contained in subsequent 14 provisions of this title which are applicable to specific 15 provisions of this title, the following words and phrases when 16 17 used in this title shall have, unless the context clearly 18 indicates otherwise, the meanings given to them in this section: 19 * * * "Utility terrain vehicle" or "UTV." A motorized off-highway 20

vehicle equipped with four or more tires, bucket seats or bench

- 1 seats, not including a saddle, that has:
- 2 (1) a maximum width of 64 inches and a maximum dry
- 3 weight of 1,700 pounds;
- 4 (2) a width that exceeds 64 inches or a dry weight that
- 5 <u>exceeds 1,700 pounds.</u>
- 6 The term does not include an ATV, snowmobile, trail bike,
- 7 motorboat, golf cart, aircraft, dune buggy, automobile,
- 8 construction machine, truck or home utility machine; military,
- 9 fire, emergency and law enforcement vehicle; implement of
- 10 husbandry; multipurpose agricultural vehicle; vehicle used by
- 11 the department; a vehicle that is or is required to be
- 12 registered under Chapter 13 (relating to registration of
- 13 <u>vehicles</u>); or off-road motor vehicle used exclusively as a
- 14 utility vehicle for an agricultural or business operation and
- 15 incidentally operated or moved upon the highway.

- 17 Section 2. Title 75 is amended by adding a section to read:
- 18 § 1789. Utility terrain vehicles.
- 19 (a) Minimum coverage requirements. -- A utility terrain
- 20 <u>vehicle that is registered or operated on a highway shall be</u>
- 21 covered by the financial responsibility required under
- 22 <u>Subchapter A (relating to general provisions).</u>
- 23 (b) Exemption from other coverages. -- For a utility terrain
- 24 <u>vehicle</u>, a person may not be required to purchase and an insurer
- 25 may not be required to offer or make available any other
- 26 coverage contained in this chapter.

- 2 3597. Scope of subchapter.
- 3 3597.1. Required equipment.
- 4 <u>3597.2. Display of registration plate.</u>
- 5 <u>3597.3. Operation on certain highways or roadways.</u>
- 6 <u>3597.4. Same treatment as passenger cars.</u>
- 7 <u>3597.5. Seating limitation.</u>
- 8 § 3597. Scope of subchapter.
- 9 This subchapter applies to the operation of utility terrain
- 10 vehicles on certain highways or roadways in this Commonwealth.
- 11 § 3597.1. Required equipment.
- 12 <u>(a) General rule.--A utility terrain vehicle operated upon a</u>
- 13 <u>highway or roadway in this Commonwealth shall be maintained in</u>
- 14 proper condition, comply with the equipment requirements and
- 15 <u>standards specified in 49 CFR 571.500 (relating to Standard No.</u>
- 16 500; Low-speed vehicles) and be equipped with the following
- 17 additional equipment:
- 18 <u>(1) Brakes adequate to control the movement of and to</u>
- 19 stop the vehicle.
- 20 <u>(2) An odometer.</u>
- 21 (3) A speedometer.
- 22 (4) The original manufacturer's vehicle identification
- 23 number die stamped upon the body or frame, or both, of the
- 24 <u>vehicle or the original manufacturer's vehicle identification</u>
- 25 number die stamped upon the engine or motor of the vehicle.
- 26 <u>(5)</u> A horn.
- 27 <u>(6) Headlights.</u>
- 28 (7) Taillights.
- 29 (8) Turn signals.
- 30 <u>(9) Rearview mirrors.</u>

- 1 (10) A windshield with a windshield wiper, unless the
- 2 <u>operator and any passenger wear eye protection.</u>
- 3 (11) A tail lamp or other lamp constructed and placed to
- 4 <u>illuminate the registration plate.</u>
- 5 (b) Exemptions.--
- 6 (1) A utility terrain vehicle shall be exempt from
- 7 <u>equipment requirements not enumerated in this subchapter.</u>
- 8 (2) A utility terrain vehicle registered outside of this
- 9 <u>Commonwealth shall not be found in violation of this</u>
- 10 subchapter, provided the UTV is in full compliance with this
- 11 <u>subchapter and subsection (a).</u>
- 12 (3) A utility terrain vehicle shall not be subject to
- emissions or safety inspections.
- 14 (4) A utility terrain vehicle shall be exempt from the
- 15 requirements of this subchapter if being operated in
- 16 <u>accordance with sections 7722 (relating to designation of</u>
- snowmobile and ATV roads) and 7723 (relating to special
- snowmobile and ATV events).
- 19 (c) Penalties. -- An individual who operates a utility terrain
- 20 vehicle without the equipment prescribed in subsection (a) shall
- 21 be subject to the penalties under section 6502 (relating to
- 22 summary offenses).
- 23 § 3597.2. Display of registration plate.
- 24 (a) General rule. -- A registration plate for a utility
- 25 terrain vehicle shall, at all times, be securely fastened to the
- 26 UTV to which it is assigned or on which the UTV's use is
- 27 <u>authorized in accordance with regulations promulgated by the</u>
- 28 <u>department</u>.
- 29 (b) UTV registration plate. -- The department shall produce a
- 30 registration plate for a UTV that displays the identifying

- 1 characters on the plate. The department shall issue the plate
- 2 upon application and payment of the fee in subsection (c).
- 3 (c) Fees.--The department shall collect an annual
- 4 registration fee of \$30 which fee shall be distributed as
- 5 <u>follows:</u>
- 6 (1) Ten dollars to the Motor License Fund.
- 7 (2) Ten dollars to the ATV Management Restricted
- 8 Account.
- 9 <u>(3) Ten dollars to the municipality of which the</u>
- 10 registrant resides.
- 11 § 3597.3. Operation on certain highways or roadways.
- 12 (a) Operation on State highways.--
- (1) Except as otherwise provided under paragraph (2), a
- 14 utility terrain vehicle may not be operated upon a highway or
- 15 <u>roadway under the jurisdiction of the department with a</u>
- posted speed in excess of 55 miles per hour.
- 17 (2) The secretary may, by order, permit the use of a
- 18 utility terrain vehicle upon a highway or roadway under the
- jurisdiction of the department where the posted speed limit
- is greater than 55 miles per hour but not greater than 65
- 21 miles per hour.
- 22 (3) An order issued by the secretary under paragraph (2)
- 23 <u>shall be transmitted to the Legislative Reference Bureau for</u>
- 24 publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- 25 (4) Except as otherwise provided under paragraph (2), a
- 26 utility terrain vehicle may not be operated upon a limited
- 27 access highway or divided highway.
- 28 (b) Operation on local roadways.--
- 29 (1) Except as otherwise provided under paragraph (2) or
- 30 (3), a utility terrain vehicle may not be operated upon a

- 1 <u>highway or roadway under the jurisdiction of a local</u>
- 2 authority with a posted speed limit in excess of 45 miles per
- 3 <u>hour.</u>
- 4 (2) A local authority may, by ordinance or resolution,
- 5 <u>as appropriate, in the case of any roadway under the local</u>
- 6 <u>authority's jurisdiction, permit the use of a utility terrain</u>
- 7 <u>vehicle where the posted speed limit is greater than 45 miles</u>
- 8 per hour but not greater than 55 miles per hour.
- 9 (3) A local authority may, by ordinance or resolution,
- 10 <u>as appropriate, prohibit the use of a utility terrain vehicle</u>
- on a roadway under the local authority's jurisdiction where
- 12 the local authority determines that the operation of a
- 13 <u>utility terrain vehicle would constitute a hazard.</u>
- 14 (c) Violation. -- A person who operates a utility terrain
- 15 vehicle upon a highway or roadway in violation of this section
- 16 shall be subject to the penalties under section 6502 (relating
- 17 to summary offenses).
- 18 § 3597.4. Same treatment as passenger cars.
- 19 Except as otherwise provided in this subchapter, a utility
- 20 <u>terrain vehicle shall be considered a passenger car for the</u>
- 21 purposes of Part II (relating to title, registration and
- 22 <u>licensing</u>) and section 4581 (relating to restraint systems).
- 23 § 3597.5. Seating limitation.
- A utility terrain vehicle may not be operated:
- 25 (1) at a time during which the number of passengers
- 26 <u>exceeds the number of available safety belts in the UTV; or</u>
- 27 (2) on a highway with a speed limit in excess of 45
- 28 <u>miles per hour, if a passenger requires a child passenger</u>
- 29 restraint system or booster seat.

- 2 § 3722. Off-road vehicles in urban municipalities.
- 3 (a) Prohibition. -- Except as provided in <u>Subchapter G of</u>
- 4 Chapter 35 (relating to operation of utility terrain vehicles),
- 5 Subchapter C of Chapter 77 (relating to operation), subsection
- 6 (b) or otherwise provided by this title or other law of this
- 7 Commonwealth, including local ordinances adopted by urban
- 8 municipalities, no individual may operate an all-terrain vehicle
- 9 or a dirt bike on any of the following public areas within the
- 10 boundaries of an urban municipality:
- 11 (1) A highway, including the berm or shoulder.
- 12 (2) A sidewalk.
- 13 (3) A pedalcycle lane.

- 15 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
