## AN ACT

9	Section 1. Section 604 of the act of June 24, 1931
10	(P.L.1206, No.331), known as The First Class Township Code,
11	reenacted and amended May 27, 1949 (P.L.1955, No.569), is
12	amended to read:
13	Section 604. [Failure of Officer to Perform DutiesIf any
14	township officer refuses or neglects to perform his duties, the
15	court of quarter sessions, upon complaint in writing by one
16	hundred citizens, owners of real estate residing in the
17	township, may issue a rule upon such officer to show cause why
18	his office should not be declared vacant and another appointed
19	in his stead. Such rule shall be made returnable not less than
20	two weeks from its date of issue. Upon hearing and proof that

1	the facts alleged in the complaint are true, the court may
2	declare the office vacant and appoint another in his stead, to
3	hold office for the unexpired term.] <u>Removal of Township</u>
4	Officers and AppointeesWhether elected or duly appointed to
5	fill a vacancy in elective office, a township officer shall be
6	removable from office only by impeachment, or by the Governor
7	for reasonable cause after due notice and full hearing on the
8	advice of two-thirds of the Senate, or upon conviction of
9	misbehavior in office or of an infamous crime in accordance with
10	the Constitution of Pennsylvania, but the officer's title to
11	office may be tried by proceedings of quo warranto as provided
12	<u>by law.</u>

13 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
