AN ACT

- 1 Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An
- act relating to the public school system, including certain
- 3 provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in terms and courses of study,
- 6 providing for media literacy education.
- 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 8 hereby enacts as follows:
- 9 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 10 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
- 11 section to read:
- 12 Section 1555. Media Literacy Education. -- (a) The Department
- 13 of Education, in consultation with the State Board of Education,
- 14 shall:
- 15 (1) Develop, within six (6) months of the effective date of
- 16 this section, an age-appropriate model curriculum for students
- 17 <u>in kindergarten through grade twelve for media literacy</u>
- 18 instruction. Beginning with the school year that commences after
- 19 the effective date of this section, a school district shall

- 1 <u>incorporate into the school curriculum a component regarding</u>
- 2 media literacy.
- 3 (2) The curriculum may include, but need not be limited to:
- 4 (i) developing critical thinking skills;
- 5 (ii) understanding how media messages shape culture and
- 6 <u>society;</u>
- 7 (iii) identifying target-marketing strategies;
- 8 (iv) naming techniques of persuasion used;
- 9 (v) recognizing bias and misinformation;
- 10 (vi) discovering parts of a story that are not being told;
- 11 <u>and</u>
- 12 (vii) evaluating media messages based on personal
- 13 <u>experiences</u>, <u>skills</u>, <u>beliefs</u> and <u>values</u>.
- 14 (3) The State Board of Education shall make this curriculum
- 15 <u>available on its publicly accessible Internet website.</u>
- 16 (4) The Department of Education shall make available to
- 17 <u>school districts on the Department of Education's Internet</u>
- 18 website a list of resources and materials on media literacy and
- 19 shall ensure that approved media literacy training opportunities
- 20 are made available for use in professional development programs
- 21 for teachers.
- 22 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
