## AN ACT

- Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain
- provisions applicable as well to private and parochial
- schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the
- laws relating thereto," in school districts, requiring radon
- reports; and, in grounds and buildings, requiring radon
- 7 tests.
- 8 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 9 hereby enacts as follows:
- 10 Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
- 11 as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding sections
- 12 to read:
- 13 Section 223.1. Radon Report. -- The board of directors of each
- 14 school district shall contact the parent or guardian of each
- 15 student in writing within ten business days of the start of the
- 16 <u>school year regarding:</u>
- 17 (1) The date the radon testing under section 787 was
- 18 conducted in the school buildings in the school district in the
- 19 prior school year.
- 20 (2) The highest radon level recorded and the school building

- 1 where the level was recorded.
- 2 (3) Notice, if applicable, that no testing has been
- 3 <u>conducted in a particular school building.</u>
- 4 (4) That the Environmental Protection Agency considers radon
- 5 <u>levels above four picocuries per liter to be potentially</u>
- 6 <u>dangerous</u>.
- 7 Section 787. Radon Testing. -- (a) Each school district shall
- 8 complete initial radon tests in school buildings in the school
- 9 <u>district as follows:</u>
- 10 (1) Except as set forth in paragraph (3), for a school
- 11 building in existence on the effective date of this section, by
- 12 June 30, 2014.
- 13 (2) For a school building constructed after the effective
- 14 date of this section, within nineteen months of the date of
- 15 occupancy.
- 16 (3) For a school building in existence on the effective date
- 17 of this section but remodeled after the effective date of this
- 18 section, within nineteen months of the date of completion of the
- 19 remodeling.
- 20 (b) Each school district shall continue to make radon tests
- 21 in school buildings in the school districts every five years
- 22 after the initial test in subsection (a).
- 23 (c) The results of the tests shall be on file and available
- 24 for review at each school within the school district.
- 25 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
