AN ACT

- 1 Amending Title 71 (State Government) of the Pennsylvania
- 2 Consolidated Statutes, in preliminary provisions relating to
- retirement for State employees and officers, further
- 4 providing for definitions.
- 5 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- 6 hereby enacts as follows:
- 7 Section 1. The definition of "State employee" in section
- 8 5102 of Title 71 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes is
- 9 amended to read:
- 10 § 5102. Definitions.
- 11 The following words and phrases as used in this part, unless
- 12 a different meaning is plainly required by the context, shall
- 13 have the following meanings:
- 14 * * *
- "State employee." Any person holding a State office or
- 16 position under the Commonwealth, employed by the State
- 17 Government of the Commonwealth, in any capacity whatsoever,
- 18 except an independent contractor or any person compensated on a

- 1 fee basis or any person paid directly by an entity other than a
- 2 State Employees' Retirement System employer, and shall include
- 3 members of the General Assembly, and any officer or employee of
- 4 the following:
- 5 (1) (i) The Department of Education.
- 6 (ii) State-owned educational institutions.
- 7 (iii) Community colleges.
- 8 (iv) The Pennsylvania State University, except an
 9 employee in the College of Agriculture who is paid wholly
 10 from Federal funds or an employee who is participating in
 11 the Federal Civil Service Retirement System. The
 12 university shall be totally responsible for all employer
 13 contributions under section 5507 (relating to
- 14 contributions by the Commonwealth and other employers).

 15 (2) The Pennsylvania Turnpike Commission, the Delaware

 16 River Port Authority, the Port Authority Transit Corporation,

 17 the Philadelphia Regional Port Authority, the Delaware River

 18 Joint Toll Bridge Commission, the State Public School

 19 Building Authority, The General State Authority, the State

 20 Highway and Bridge Authority, the Delaware Valley Regional
- 21 Planning Commission[,] <u>and</u> the Interstate Commission of the
- Delaware River Basin[, and the Susquehanna River Basin
- Commission] any time subsequent to its creation, provided the
- commission or authority agrees to contribute and does
- contribute to the fund, from time to time, the moneys
- 26 required to build up the reserves necessary for the payment
- of the annuities of such officers and employees without any
- liability on the part of the Commonwealth to make
- appropriations for such purposes, and provided in the case of
- 30 employees of the Interstate Commission of the Delaware River

- Basin, that the employee shall have been a member of the system for at least ten years prior to January 1, 1963.
- 3 (3) Any separate independent public corporation created by statute, not including any municipal or quasi-municipal 4 5 corporation, so long as he remains an officer or employee of 6 such public corporation, and provided that such officer or 7 employee of such public corporation was an employee of the 8 Commonwealth immediately prior to his employment by such 9 corporation, and further provided such public corporation 10 shall agree to contribute and contributes to the fund, from time to time, the moneys required to build up the reserves 11 12 necessary for the payment of the annuities of such officers 13 and employees without any liability on the part of the 14 Commonwealth to make appropriations for such purposes.

- 16 Section 2. The amendment of the definition of "State
- 17 employee" in 71 Pa.C.S. § 5102 shall apply to employees of the
- 18 Susquehanna River Basin Commission hired on or after the
- 19 effective date of this section.
- 20 Section 3. This act shall take effect immediately.
