(A) GENERAL RULE.--INSTITUTIONS OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND 1 2 PRIVATE LICENSED SCHOOLS SHALL ESTABLISH AND IMPLEMENT AN 3 EDUCATION PROGRAM FOR ALL STUDENTS. 22 (4) INFORMATION RELATING TO RISK EDUCATION AND PERSONAL23 PROTECTION.

(5) INFORMATION ON WHERE AND HOW TO GET ASSISTANCE,
INCLUDING THE IMPORTANCE OF MEDICAL TREATMENT AND EVIDENCE
COLLECTION, AND HOW TO REPORT SEXUAL VIOLENCE TO CAMPUS
AUTHORITIES AND LOCAL LAW ENFORCEMENT.

(C) NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS, ACCOMMODATIONS AND PROTECTIVE 3 MEASURES. -- A CONCISE NOTIFICATION OF RIGHTS, ACCOMMODATIONS AND 4 PROTECTIVE MEASURES SHALL BE MADE AVAILABLE IN WRITING AND ON 5 THE INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION'S OR PRIVATE LICENSED 6 7 SCHOOL'S PUBLICLY ACCESSIBLE INTERNET WEBSITE TO STUDENTS AND EMPLOYEES, INCLUDING VICTIMS OF DATING VIOLENCE, DOMESTIC 8 VIOLENCE, SEXUAL VIOLENCE [AND], STALKING AND HUMAN TRAFFICKING, 9 10 REGARDLESS OF WHERE THE INCIDENCES OCCURRED, INCLUDING 11 INFORMATION REGARDING:

12 (1) EXISTING COUNSELING, MENTAL HEALTH, HEALTH CARE,
13 VICTIM ADVOCACY, LEGAL ASSISTANCE AND OTHER SERVICES
14 AVAILABLE FOR VICTIMS, BOTH WITHIN THE INSTITUTION OR SCHOOL
15 AND IN THE COMMUNITY.

24 SECTION 2004-G. FOLLOW-UP.

25 AN INSTITUTION OF HIGHER EDUCATION AND PRIVATE LICENSED 26 SCHOOL SHALL CONDUCT AT LEAST ONE FOLLOW-UP PROGRAM FOR THE 27 STUDENTS IN THE EDUCATION PROGRAM. THE FOLLOW-UP PROGRAM MAY 28 CONSIST OF THE FOLLOWING:

29 (1) LECTURERS AND INTERACTIVE LEARNING PROGRAMS RELATING
 30 TO SEXUAL VIOLENCE, DATING VIOLENCE, DOMESTIC VIOLENCE [AND],

THE ACT IS AMENDED BY ADDING A SECTION TO READ: Section 2004-I. Human trafficking prevention and education 9 10 programs. (a) Duty to provide. -- An institution of higher education 11 shall provide first-year students voluntary access to at least 12 three in-depth prevention and education programs regarding human_ 13 14 trafficking at any time during the school year, including during 15 new student orientation activities. 16 (b) Program materials. -- An institution of higher education shall provide program materials relating to the human 17 18 trafficking prevention and education programs at no cost to 19 participating students and may utilize program materials offered by a nonprofit organization that specializes in outreach and 20 education programs on human trafficking. 21 22 (c) Specific subject matter. -- The human trafficking 23 prevention and education programs shall specifically provide 24 students the following: 25 (1) Definitions and nature of human trafficking. 26 (2) Current Federal and State laws relating to human 27 trafficking. 28 (3) Facts and statistics on human trafficking in this 29 Commonwealth and throughout the United States. (4) How human traffickers profile victims. 30
