15	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
16	hereby enacts as follows:
17	Section 1. Section 2 of the act of July 9, 1987 (P.L.220,
18	No.39), known as the Social Workers, Marriage and Family
19	Therapists and Professional Counselors Act, is amended to read:
20	Section 2. Legislative intent.
21	The practice of social work, marriage and family therapy
22	[and], professional counseling and professional art therapy
23	within this Commonwealth is hereby declared to affect the public
24	safety and welfare and to be subject to regulation and control

in the public interest to protect the public from 1 2 unprofessional, improper, unauthorized and unqualified practice 3 of licensed social work, licensed marriage and family therapy [and], licensed professional counseling and licensed 4 professional art therapy. This act regulates only those who hold 5 themselves out as licensed social workers, licensed clinical 6 7 social workers, licensed marriage and family therapists [or as], 8 licensed professional counselors or licensed professional art therapists. Acquisition of a license under this act shall not be 9 10 made a condition of the employment of a person by the Commonwealth or any of its political subdivisions or by 11 12 nonprofit agencies. 13 Section 2. The definition of "diagnosis" in section 3 of the act, amended June 29, 2018 (P.L.505, No.76), is amended and the 14 15 section is amended by adding definitions to read: Section 3. Definitions. 16 17 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall have the meanings given to them in this section unless the 18 19 context clearly indicates otherwise: 20 * * * 21 "Certified art therapist." An individual holding national board certification from the Art Therapy Credentials Board. 22 * * * 23 24 "Diagnosis." The term includes the following: 25 (1) A clinical social work assessment, a marriage and 26 family therapist assessment [or] _ a professional counselor assessment or a professional art therapy assessment. 27 28 (2)The utilization of currently accepted diagnostic 29 classifications by a clinical social worker, a marriage and family therapist [or], a professional counselor or a 30

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1	professional art therapist, including, but not limited to,
2	the American Psychiatric Association's Diagnostic and
3	Statistical Manual of Mental Disorders, as amended and
4	supplemented, but only to the extent of the clinical social
5	worker's, marriage and family therapist's [or], professional
6	counselor's or professional art therapist's education,
7	training, experience and scope of practice as established by
8	this act.

10	"Independent practice of professional art therapy." The
11	application of professional art therapy knowledge and skills by
12	an individual:
13	(1) who styles oneself as a professional art therapist;
14	(2) who regulates and is responsible for his or her own
15	practice and treatment procedures; and
16	(3) whose practice is not affiliated with any other
17	practice, health care facility, government agency or
18	government-regulated social service agency.

20	"Licensed professional art therapist." An individual who
21	engages in the practice of professional art therapy and who
22	holds a current license under this act.
23	* * *
24	"Practice of professional art therapy." The integrative
25	application of psychotherapeutic principles and methods with
26	specialized training in strategic use of art media, the
27	neurobiological implications of art making and art-based
28	assessment models. The term includes the following:
29	(1) The evaluation, assessment, diagnosis and treatment
30	of normal and abnormal cognitive, developmental, behavioral

1	and emotional disorders in individuals, families and groups.
2	(2) Strategic application of therapeutic art
3	interventions, in the context of applied psychological theory
4	<u>in a psychotherapeutic relationship.</u>
5	(3) Facilitation of visual, nonverbal and verbal
6	receptive and expressive communication and implementation of
7	treatment plans to help clients improve cognitive and sensory
8	motor functions, increase self-awareness and self-esteem,
9	cope with traumatic experience and grief, reduce symptoms of
10	depression, anger and distress and improve educational
11	performance, vocational performance and social functioning.
12	* * *
13	"Professional art therapy assessment." The professional
14	application of psychotherapeutic and art therapy theories and
15	techniques to evaluate, identify and establish plans for
16	treatment of individuals, families and groups with emotional,
17	mental, addiction and behavioral disorders. The term includes a
18	mental health examination and psychological history.

20	Section 3. Sections 4, $5(a)$, (k) and (1) and $6(2)$ and (3) of
21	the act are amended to read:
22	Section 4. License required.
23	It shall be unlawful for any person to hold himself or
24	herself forth as a licensed bachelor social worker, licensed
25	social worker, licensed clinical social worker, licensed
26	marriage and family therapist $[or]_{\boldsymbol{L}}$ licensed professional
27	counselor <u>or licensed professional art therapist</u> unless he or
28	she shall first have obtained a license pursuant to this act.
29	Section 5. State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family
30	Therapists and Professional Counselors.

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1 (a) Creation. -- There is hereby created the State Board of 2 Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional 3 Counselors, a departmental administrative board in the Department of State. The board shall consist of [13] 15 members 4 who are citizens of the United States and who have been 5 6 residents of this Commonwealth for a two-year period, two of whom shall be public members; five of whom shall be licensed 7 8 social workers, at least one of whom shall be a licensed clinical social worker and at least one of whom shall be a 9 10 licensed social worker; two of whom shall be licensed marriage and family therapists; two of whom shall be licensed 11 12 professional counselors; one of whom shall be either a licensed marriage and family therapist or a licensed professional 13 14 counselor whose membership shall rotate between those 15 professions at the expiration of the member's second term; two 16 of whom shall be licensed professional art therapists; and one 17 of whom shall be the Commissioner of Professional and 18 Occupational Affairs.

(k) Notice.--Reasonable notice of all meetings shall be
given in conformity with [the act of July 3, 1986 (P.L.388,
No.84), known as the Sunshine Act] <u>65 Pa.C.S. Ch. 7 (relating to</u>
<u>open meetings)</u>.

(1) Operating procedures.--The board shall meet within 30 days after the appointment of its new members and set up operating procedures and develop application forms for licensing clinical social workers, marriage and family therapists and professional counselors. It shall be the responsibility of the board to circulate these forms and educate the public to the requirements of licensing in order to hold oneself out as a

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licensed bachelor social worker, licensed social worker, 1 2 licensed clinical social worker, licensed marriage and family 3 therapist [or], licensed professional counselor or licensed professional art therapist within the Commonwealth. 4 5 Section 6. Powers and functions of board. 6 The board shall have the following powers: * * * 7 8 (2)To adopt and, from time to time, revise such rules 9 and regulations as may be necessary to carry into effect the 10 provisions of this act. Such regulations may include, but 11 shall not be limited to, standards of professional practice 12 and conduct for licensed bachelor social workers, licensed 13 social workers, licensed clinical social workers, licensed 14 marriage and family therapists [and], licensed professional 15 counselors and licensed professional art therapists in 16 Pennsylvania. 17 To examine for, deny, approve, issue, revoke, (3) 18 suspend or renew licenses of bachelor social workers, social 19 workers, clinical social workers, marriage and family 20 therapists [and], professional counselors and professional

21 <u>art therapists</u> pursuant to this act and to conduct hearings 22 in connection therewith.

(h) Professional art therapist license.--An applicant shall
 be qualified to hold oneself out as a licensed professional art
 therapist if the applicant submits proof satisfactory to the

3	(2) The applicant has successfully met one of the			
4	following educational requirements:			
5	(i) Holds a master's degree with a minimum of 60			
6	semester hours or 90 quarter hours of graduate coursework			
7	in art therapy from a program that was approved by the			
8	American Art Therapy Association or accredited by the			
9	Commission on Accreditation of Allied Health Education			
10	Programs at the time the degree was conferred.			
11	(ii) Has successfully completed a master's degree			
12	with a minimum of 60 semester hours or 90 quarter hours			
13	of graduate coursework in art therapy or a field			
14	determined by the board by regulation to be closely			
15	related to the practice of professional art therapy.			
16	(iii) Holds a doctoral degree in art therapy from an			
17	accredited educational institution or holds a doctoral			
18	degree in a field determined by the board by regulation			
19	to be closely related to the practice of professional art			
20	therapy from an accredited educational institution.			
21	(3) The applicant has complied with the experience			
22	requirements as follows:			
23	(i) An individual meeting the educational			
24	<u>requirements of paragraph (2)(i) or (ii) must have</u>			
25	completed at least 3,000 hours of supervised clinical			
26	experience, acceptable to the board as determined by			
27	regulation, which was obtained subsequent to granting of			
28	the master's degree.			
29	(ii) An individual meeting the educational			
30	requirements of paragraph (2)(iii) must have completed at			

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1	least 2,400 hours of supervised clinical experience,			
2	acceptable to the board as determined by regulation,			
3	1,200 hours of which was obtained subsequent to the			
4	granting of the doctoral degree.			
5	(4) The applicant's postgraduate experience is completed			
6	under supervision by a licensed professional art therapist, a			
7	certified art therapist or any other licensed mental health			
8	professional acceptable to the board as determined by			
9	regulation.			
10	(5) The applicant has passed an examination adopted by			
11	the board.			
12	(6) The application has been accompanied by the			
13	application fee.			
14	(7) The applicant has not been convicted of a felony			
15	under The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic			
16	Act, or of an offense under the laws of another jurisdiction			
17	which if committed in this Commonwealth would be a felony			
18	under The Controlled Substance, Drug, Device and Cosmetic			
19	Act, unless the applicant otherwise satisfies the			
20	qualifications contained in or authorized by this act and:			
21	(i) at least five years have elapsed from the date			
22	of conviction; or			
23	(ii) the applicant satisfactorily demonstrates to			
24	the board that the applicant has made significant			
25	progress in personal rehabilitation since the conviction

(b) Issuance of licenseThe board shall issue to each
person who meets the licensure requirements of this act a
certificate setting forth that such person is licensed to hold
himself or herself out as a licensed bachelor social worker, a
licensed social worker, a licensed clinical social worker, a
licensed marriage and family therapist $[or]_{L}$ a licensed
professional counselor or a licensed professional art therapist.
Section 6. Section 9 of the act is amended by adding a

Section 9. Exemption from licensure examination.

(d) Professional art therapistsThe requirements of
section 7(h)(5) shall not apply and a license shall be issued
without examination to an applicant who meets all of the
following requirements:
(1) Has submitted an application for a professional art
therapist license, accompanied by the required fee, within
two years after the effective date of this paragraph.
(2) Can demonstrate proof of practice of professional
art therapy for at least five of the seven years immediately
prior to the date of application for license.
(3) Has successfully met one of the following

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1 educational requirements: 2 (i) Has a doctoral degree in art therapy or a field 3 determined by the board by regulation to be closely related to the practice of professional art therapy from 4 5 an accredited educational institution. 6 (ii) Has a master's degree of at least 48 semester_ 7 hours or 72 quarter hours from a program in art therapy 8 approved by the American Art Therapy Association. 9 (iii) Has a master's degree from an accredited 10 educational institution with a course of study that the Art Therapy Credentials Board has determined is 11 12 equivalent to an approved program in art therapy for 13 purposes of meeting the education requirements for 14 registration as an art therapist. 15 (4) Holds a current credential as a certified art therapist and has passed the national board certification 16 17 examination of the Art Therapy Credentials Board. 18 Section 7. Section 10 of the act, amended June 29, 2018 19 (P.L.505, No.76), is amended to read: Section 10. Reciprocity. 20 21 (a) General rule.--The board shall have the power to grant a reciprocal license to an applicant who is licensed or certified 22 23 as a bachelor social worker, social worker, clinical social 24 worker, marriage and family therapist [or], professional counselor or professional art therapist in another state and has 25 26 demonstrated qualifications which equal or exceed those required pursuant to this act in the determination of the board, provided 27 28 that no license shall be granted under this section to an 29 applicant unless the state in which the applicant is licensed 30 affords reciprocal treatment to persons who are residents of

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1 this Commonwealth and who are licensed pursuant to this act. 2 Emergencies. -- The board shall have the power to allow an (b) individual who is licensed or certified as a clinical social 3 worker, a marriage and family therapist [or], a professional 4 counselor or a professional art therapist in another state to 5 practice in this Commonwealth without licensure for no more than 6 7 60 days as part of a relief effort related to a state of 8 emergency as declared by the Federal Government or the Governor. 9 Section 8. Section 10.1 of the act is amended by adding a 10 subsection to read: Section 10.1. Endorsement of out-of-State licenses. 11 * * * 12 13 (d) Professional art therapist. -- The board may issue a 14 professional art therapist license without examination to an applicant holding a professional art therapist or equivalent 15 mental health license in another state who submits proof 16 satisfactory to the board of all of the following: 17 18 (1) The applicant is of good moral character. 19 (2) The applicant meets the educational requirements as 20 specified in section 7(h)(2). 21 (3) The applicant has completed a minimum of 3,000 hours 22 of supervised clinical experience acceptable to the board. 23 (4) The applicant holds a license that is in good 24 standing from another state. 25 (5) The applicant has, at a minimum, been actively 26 engaged in the practice of professional art therapy work for five of the last seven years immediately preceding the filing 27 of the application for licensure by endorsement with the_ 28 29 board. (6) The applicant has submitted an application 30

26	Unless ordered to do so by Commonwealth Court or an appeal
27	therefrom, the board shall not reinstate the license of a person
28	to practice as a bachelor social worker, social worker, clinical
29	social worker, marriage and family therapist $[or]_{L}$ professional
30	counselor or professional art therapist pursuant to this act,

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which has been revoked. Any person whose license has been 1 2 revoked may apply for reinstatement, after a period of at least 3 five years, but must meet all of the licensing qualifications of this act, including the examination requirement, if he or she 4 desires to practice as a bachelor social worker, social worker, 5 6 clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist [or], 7 professional counselor or professional art therapist pursuant to 8 this act at any time after such revocation.

17 professional art therapists, professional art therapists or art

18 therapists. It shall be unlawful for an individual to style

19 <u>oneself as a professional art therapist, advertise or engage in</u>

20 the independent practice of professional art therapy or use any

21 words or symbols indicating or tending to indicate that the

22 individual is a licensed professional art therapist,

23 professional art therapist or otherwise qualified to practice

24 professional art therapy without holding a license in good

25 standing under this act.

26 (b) Nonapplicability.--This section shall not apply to the

27 <u>following</u>:

28 (1) A person employed by the Commonwealth in an art

29 therapist position on the effective date of this subsection,

30 <u>during the time of employment by the Commonwealth in that</u>

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1 <u>position.</u>

2	(2) A person who holds a valid license or is certified
3	or regulated pursuant to another professional licensure law
4	or State certification of the Commonwealth and who is
5	credentialed by the Art Therapy Credentials Board as a
6	certified art therapist.
7	(3) A person who is practicing professional art therapy
8	under supervision to meet the supervised clinical experience
9	requirement to become a licensed professional art therapist
10	pursuant to this act if the person does not represent himself
11	or herself as a licensed professional art therapist or
12	professional art therapist.
13	(4) A student enrolled in an art therapy academic
14	program with an accredited educational institution while
15	practicing art therapy under qualified supervision and as
16	part of an approved course of study if the person does not
17	represent himself or herself as a professional art therapist
18	or art therapist. A student enrolled in an art therapy
19	program may identify himself or herself only as an "art
20	therapy student" or "art therapy intern."

25	(b) Civil penaltyIn addition to any other civil remedy or
26	criminal penalty provided for in this act, the board, by a vote
27	of the majority of the maximum number of the authorized
28	membership of the board as provided by law, or by a vote of the
29	majority of the duly qualified and confirmed membership or a
30	minimum of three members, whichever is greater, may levy a civil
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penalty of up to \$10,000 on any current licensee who violates 1 2 any provision of this act, on any person who engages in the 3 independent practice of clinical social work, the independent practice of marriage and family therapy [or], the independent 4 practice of professional counseling or the independent practice_ 5 of professional art therapy without being licensed pursuant to 6 7 this act or on any person who holds himself or herself out as a 8 licensed bachelor social worker, licensed social worker, licensed clinical social worker, licensed marriage and family 9 10 therapist, licensed professional counselor or marriage and family therapist or licensed professional art therapist or 11 12 professional art therapist without being so licensed pursuant to 13 this act. The board shall levy this penalty only after affording 14 the accused party the opportunity for a hearing, as provided in 15 Title 2 of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes (relating to 16 administrative law and procedure).

(b) Records.--A record of all persons licensed to practice as bachelor social workers, social workers, clinical social workers, marriage and family therapists [and], professional counselors <u>and professional art therapists</u> in Pennsylvania shall be kept in the office of the board and shall be open to public inspection and copying upon payment of a nominal fee for copying the record.

29 Section 13. Section 20(a) of the act, amended June 29, 201830 (P.L.505, No.76), is amended to read:

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1 Section 20. Unlawful practice.

2 Unlawful practice prohibited. -- It shall be unlawful for (a) 3 any person to engage in the independent practice of clinical social work, the independent practice of marriage and family 4 therapy [or], the independent practice of professional 5 counseling or the independent practice of professional art_ 6 7 therapy or hold himself or herself out as a licensed bachelor 8 social worker, licensed social worker, licensed clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist [and], professional 9 10 counselor and licensed professional art therapist without 11 possessing a valid, unexpired, unrevoked and unsuspended license 12 issued under this act.

14 Section 14. Within 60 days of the effective date of this 15 section, the Governor shall nominate two professional members to 16 serve as the licensed professional art therapist members of the State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists 17 18 and Professional Counselors. The professional members initially 19 appointed pursuant to this section need not be licensed by the 20 licensure examination adopted by the State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional 21 Counselors but, at the time of appointment, must satisfy all 22 23 other requirements of this act for licensure as a professional 24 art therapist.
