1 2 3 4 5 6	Amending the act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), entitled "An act relating to the public school system, including certain provisions applicable as well to private and parochial schools; amending, revising, consolidating and changing the laws relating thereto," in school directors, providing for county-wide board of school directors pilot program.
7	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
8	hereby enacts as follows:
9	Section 1. The act of March 10, 1949 (P.L.30, No.14), known
10	as the Public School Code of 1949, is amended by adding a
11	section to read:
12	Section 330. County-Wide Board of School Directors Pilot
13	Program(a) The General Assembly finds and declares as
14	<u>follows:</u>
15	(1) The Commonwealth's system of public education is
16	presently comprised of five hundred (500) independently
17	operating school districts.
18	(2) School districts are governed by locally elected school
19	boards, which are responsible for establishing educational
20	programs and local policies, maintaining school buildings and

1	developing and approving school district budgets, including the	
2	imposition of a local property tax.	
3	(3) It is important that school board members be informed in	
4	making decisions for their school districts and be encouraged to	
5	pursue creative solutions that both enhance educational	
6	opportunities for their students and use taxpayer resources	
7	efficiently and effectively.	
8	(4) Collaboration among school board members representing	
9	neighboring school districts should increase in order to	
10	leverage ideas and resources.	
11	(5) It is the intent of this section to foster increased	
12	collaborative decision-making among school boards by creating a	
13	pilot program that will consolidate school boards to the county-	
14	wide level.	
15	(b) Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of this	
16	section, the Secretary of Education shall designate a county of	
17	the fourth class in which shall be established a county-wide	
18	board of school directors that shall have the power and duty to	
19	govern each school district which is located in whole or in part	
20	within the county. In designating a county of the fourth class	
21	under this subsection, the Secretary of Education shall consider	
22	the local tax effort of the school districts within the county	
23	to be designated, including whether the equalized millage rate	
24	of each school district is greater than the Statewide average	
25	equalized millage rate.	
26	(c) Within one (1) year of the effective date of this	
27	section, notwithstanding any other provision of law or	
28	regulation to the contrary, all powers and duties of the board	
29	of school directors of each school district that is located in	
30	whole or in part within the county designated under subsection	
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1 (b) shall be vested in a county-wide board of school directors 2 to be established under subsection (d). 3 (d) (1) Subject to paragraphs (2) and (3), the county-wide board of school directors established under this section shall 4 consist of two (2) members representing each school district 5 which is located in whole or in part within the county_ 6 7 designated under subsection (b). Each qualified voter residing 8 in a school district to be governed by the county-wide board of school directors shall be entitled to cast votes for two (2) 9 10 individuals who reside in that school district under guidelines which the Department of State, in consultation with the board of 11 elections for the county designated under subsection (b), shall 12 13 establish for this purpose within ninety (90) days of the 14 effective date of this section. 15 (2) If the election of two (2) school directors representing 16 each school district which is located in whole or in part within the county designated under subsection (b) would result in the 17 election of an even number of school directors, each qualified 18 19 voter residing in a school district to be governed by the county-wide board of school directors also shall be entitled to 20 cast a vote for an additional at large school director, who 21 shall reside within a school district to be governed by the 22 23 county-wide board of school directors, under guidelines which 24 the Department of State, in consultation with the board of elections for the county designated under subsection (b), shall_ 25 26 establish for this purpose within ninety (90) days of the effective date of this section. 27 28 (3) Where any of the school districts to be governed by the 29 county-wide board of school directors is located in part within a county other than the county designated under subsection (b), 30

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the boards of elections for all counties in which such school 1 2 districts are located in whole or in part shall cooperate with 3 the Department of State in the establishment of the guidelines 4 required under this subsection. 5 (e) The members of the county-wide board of school directors established under this section shall have the power and duty to 6 7 cast votes with respect to the affairs of all school districts 8 that are governed by the county-wide board of school directors, notwithstanding each member's school district of residence. 9 10 (f) The office of county-wide school director shall be considered a full-time, paid position. Members of the county-11

12 wide board of school directors shall receive compensation in the

13 form and amount that shall be determined by the Secretary of

14 Education and shall be paid jointly by the school districts

15 governed by the county-wide board of school directors. Each

16 school district shall pay for the compensation of the two (2)

17 school directors representing that school district as well as an

18 equal share of the compensation of any at large school director

19 elected under subsection (d) (2) and shall provide administrative

20 support, office space and any other assistance necessary to

21 carry out the duties of this section. Office space for any at

22 large school director elected under subsection (d)(2) shall be

23 provided by the school district in which the at large school

24 <u>director resides.</u>

(g) Individuals serving as county-wide school directors
under this section shall not have the right to elect membership
in the Public School Employees' Retirement System established
under 24 Pa.C.S. Pt. IV (relating to retirement for school
employees) or the Pennsylvania State Employees' Retirement
System established under 71 Pa.C.S. Pt. XXV (relating to

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1	retirement for State employees and officers), nor shall service
2	as a county-wide school director under this section be eligible
3	for credit in the Public School Employees' Retirement System or
4	<u>the Pennsylvania State Employees' Retirement System.</u>
5	(h) This section shall expire ten (10) years after the
6	effective date of this section. Elections to the board of school
7	directors of each individual school district governed by the
8	county-wide board of school directors established under this
9	section shall occur during the calendar year immediately prior
10	to expiration of this section under procedures provided in this
11	act and in the act of June 3, 1937 (P.L.1333, No.320), known as
12	<u>the "Pennsylvania Election Code."</u>
13	Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
