AN ACT

1	Providing for parental rights protection.
2	The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
3	hereby enacts as follows:
4	Section 1. Short title.
5	This act shall be known and may be cited as the Parental
6	Rights Protection Act.
7	Section 2. Definitions.
8	The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
9	have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
10	context clearly indicates otherwise:
11	"Commonwealth agency." Any of the following:
12	(1) The Commonwealth, including the Executive Department
13	and its boards and commissions.
14	(2) An independent administrative department, board or
15	commission.
16	(3) A public official of an entity listed under
17	paragraph (1) or (2), acting under color of State law.

"Non-Commonwealth agency." A political subdivision,
 municipal authority or other local government instrumentality
 authorized by law, or a public official of a political
 subdivision, municipal authority or other local government
 instrumentality acting under color of State law.

6 Section 3. Parental rights protected.

7 (a) General rule.--The liberty of a parent to direct the
8 upbringing, education, care and welfare of the parent's child is
9 a fundamental right.

10 (b) Infringement.--Neither a Commonwealth agency nor a non-11 Commonwealth agency may infringe upon the right under subsection 12 (a) without demonstrating that the State law or local ordinance 13 is narrowly tailored to meet a compelling governmental interest 14 by the least restrictive means.

15 Section 4. Civil relief.

A parent whose fundamental right under section 3(a) has been infringed by a Commonwealth agency or non-Commonwealth agency may bring an action in a court of competent jurisdiction seeking appropriate relief against the Commonwealth agency or non-Commonwealth agency. The court may award reasonable attorney fees to the prevailing party under this section.

22 Section 5. Construction.

Nothing in this act shall be construed to authorize a parent to engage in conduct that is unlawful or defined as child abuse in 23 Pa.C.S. § 6303(b.1) (relating to definitions).

26 Section 6. Applicability.

(a) State laws and local ordinances.--Except as provided under subsection (b), this act shall apply to a State law or local ordinance that takes effect before, on or after the effective date of this section.

1 (b) Exemption.--For a State law that takes effect after the 2 effective date of this section, this act shall not apply if the 3 State law expressly states that the provisions of this act are 4 not applicable to the State law by a specific reference to this 5 act.

- 7 This act shall take effect in 60 days.
