AN ACT

Amending Title 75 (Vehicles) of the Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes, in inspection of vehicles, further providing for 2 requirement for periodic inspection of vehicles, for 3 operation of vehicle without official certificate of inspection, for prohibition on expenditures for emission 5 inspection program, for issuance of certificate of inspection 6 and for display of certificate of inspection. 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 10 Section 1. Sections 4702(q) and 4703(b) of Title 75 of the 11 Pennsylvania Consolidated Statutes are amended by adding 12 paragraphs to read: 13 § 4702. Requirement for periodic inspection of vehicles. 14 (q) Exceptions. -- The following are exceptions to subsection 15 16 (f): * * * 17 (5) Emission inspection criteria for a subject vehicle 18 19 with a supply chain inspection waiver issued and signed by an official inspection station .-- A subject vehicle which 20

- displays a supply chain inspection waiver shall be exempt
- from the requirements for emission inspection for one month
- 3 or until a certificate of inspection can be issued, whichever
- 4 occurs first.

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- (d) Proof of insurance.--
- 14 No certificate of inspection or temporary supply 15 chain inspection waiver shall be issued unless proof of 16 financial responsibility is submitted to the inspection 17 official, who shall, on the official State Inspection record provided by the department, record the name of the insured, 18 19 the vehicle tag number, the issuing company, the policy 20 number and the expiration date. The requirement that the inspection official record financial responsibility 21 22 information shall not be construed to require the inspection 23 official to verify the information submitted.
 - (2) In those cases where the insured fails to present proof of financial responsibility to the inspection official, the inspection official, in addition to denying a certificate of inspection or temporary supply chain inspection waiver, may provide notification to the department, on the form provided by the department, within 30 days of the insured's failure to present proof of financial responsibility. Failure

- of the inspection official to make notification under this
- 2 subsection shall not impose any duty or liability on the
- 3 mechanic or station owner.

- 7 The appropriate certificate of inspection or temporary supply
- 8 <u>chain inspection waiver</u> shall be affixed to the vehicle or mass
- 9 transit vehicle as specified in regulations adopted by the
- 10 department.
- 11 Section 5. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
