AN ACT

- 6 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania
- hereby enacts as follows:
- Section 1. Section 3 of the act of July 10, 1986 (P.L.1396, 8
- No.121), known as the Women's, Infants' and Children's Nutrition
- Improvement Act, is amended by adding definitions to read: 10
- 11 Section 3. Definitions.
- 12 The following words and phrases when used in this act shall
- 13 have the meanings given to them in this section unless the
- context clearly indicates otherwise: 14
- 15
- 16 "eWIC card." The card issued to WIC eligibles for the
- 17 purpose of purchasing allowed items through the WIC Program.
- "eWIC program." The Remote eWIC Reloading Pilot Program 18
- established under section 5.1 of this act. 19

- 2 Section 2. The act is amended by adding a section to read:
- 3 <u>Section 5.1. Remote eWIC Reloading Pilot Program.</u>
- 4 (a) Establishment. -- The Remote eWIC Reloading Pilot Program
- 5 is established as a pilot program within the department.
- 6 (b) Funding. -- The department shall seek funding from the
- 7 General Fund to implement the eWIC program.
- 8 (c) Notice. -- Upon the initial appropriation of sufficient
- 9 money to implement the eWIC program, the department shall
- 10 transmit notice of the appropriation to the Legislative
- 11 Reference Bureau for publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.
- 12 (d) Eligibility. -- Individuals who are deemed to be WIC
- 13 <u>eligibles and who live in a county of the first class or a</u>
- 14 county of the second class shall be eligible to participate in
- 15 <u>the eWIC program.</u>
- 16 (e) Administration. -- The department shall administer the
- 17 eWIC program to empower WIC Program administrators in a county
- 18 of the first class or a county of the second class to
- 19 collaboratively develop a system that allows WIC funds to be
- 20 remotely reloaded onto eWIC cards administered to WIC eligibles.
- 21 The following apply:
- 22 (1) The department shall develop a remote eWIC system to
- 23 allow the <u>virtual reloading of WIC funds onto eWIC cards for</u>
- 24 the purpose of granting WIC eligibles the option of not
- 25 reporting in person to have money reloaded onto issued eWIC
- cards.
- 27 <u>(2) The department shall:</u>
- 28 <u>(i) Promulgate regulations necessary to implement</u>
- the eWIC program.
- 30 (ii) Seek any necessary waivers from the Federal

- 1 Government to implement the eWIC program.
- 2 (3) The eWIC program shall be operated for one year
- following the effective date of this section.
- 4 (f) Report.--Within one year of the conclusion of the eWIC
- 5 program, the department shall publish and transmit a report to
- 6 the General Assembly on the eWIC program, which shall include,
- 7 at a minimum, the following information:
- 8 <u>(1) The overall participation rate of WIC services in</u>
- 9 <u>each county that participated in the eWIC program.</u>
- 10 (2) The participation and nonparticipation rates among
- 11 <u>WIC eligibles in the eWIC program.</u>
- 12 (3) The participation rates of other services available
- 13 <u>to WIC eligibles that are offered to individuals who report</u>
- in person to have their eWIC cards reloaded.
- 15 <u>(4) The estimated funding necessary to implement a</u>
- remote eWIC reloading system for all WIC eligibles residing
- in this Commonwealth.
- 18 (5) Any limitations or logistical barriers that could
- 19 prevent WIC eligibles from participating in a remote eWIC
- 20 reloading system in this Commonwealth, including broadband
- 21 connectivity and program and technological infrastructure.
- 22 (6) Suggestions to address any limitations or logistical
- barriers specified in paragraph (5), following input sought
- by the department from public and private organizations using
- 25 <u>best practices that relate to the improvement of WIC</u>
- 26 services.
- 27 (q) Construction. -- Nothing in this section shall prevent WIC
- 28 eligibles from continuing to report in person to have WIC funds
- 29 <u>reloaded onto an issued eWIC card.</u>
- 30 Section 3. This act shall take effect in 180 days.
