## A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

- 1 Urging the Congress of the United States to admit Washington, 2 DC, as the 51st state of the United States of America.
- 3 WHEREAS, Washington, DC, was established in 1790 to serve as
- 4 the seat of the Federal Government; and
- 5 WHEREAS, For a brief time after the District of Columbia was
- 6 created, residents were given voting rights and had the ability
- 7 to cast ballots as residents of Maryland or Virginia; and
- 8 WHEREAS, When the District of Columbia Organic Act of 1801
- 9 passed, Washington, DC, residents were stripped of the rights to
- 10 vote in all Federal elections and Congress was given oversight
- 11 of the city; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Residents of the District of Columbia were not
- 13 afforded presidential electors until 1961 and the residents were
- 14 not given a nonvoting delegate in the United States House of
- 15 Representatives until 1970; and
- 16 WHEREAS, Since the creation of the District of Columbia, it
- 17 is the only political and geographical entity within the United
- 18 States of America whose residents have continuously been denied

- 1 their full set of rights as American citizens; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Residents of Washington, DC, pay Federal taxes,
- 3 contribute to our national economy and serve in the military but
- 4 are unable to control their own budget or have true
- 5 representation in the Federal Government; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Washington, DC, citizens face not only equal
- 7 representation issues but also racial inequality issues; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The District of Columbia is a historically Black
- 9 city with Black people still making up the majority of the
- 10 population; and
- 11 WHEREAS, American democracy systematically over represents
- 12 white voters and this is exacerbated with the lack of
- 13 representation from Washington, DC, in the Federal Government;
- 14 and
- 15 WHEREAS, Due to this lack of representation, there is wide
- 16 oppression and continuous disenfranchisement of Black Americans;
- 17 and
- 18 WHEREAS, Every year since 1991, Washington, DC's, Delegate
- 19 Eleanor Holmes Norton has introduced legislation that would
- 20 grant statehood to the district; and
- 21 WHEREAS, As a third-generation Washingtonian, Delegate Norton
- 22 has been witness to the inequalities that the denial of
- 23 statehood has brought upon Washington, DC, and continuously
- 24 fights for the district's equal representation; and
- 25 WHEREAS, This year, the bill aiming to achieve such an
- 26 important goal is H.R. 51; and
- 27 WHEREAS, At least 11 states have sponsored legislative
- 28 resolutions and issued formal letters to show their support for
- 29 Washington, DC, statehood; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Now is the time to show the people of Washington,

- 1 DC, that their voices matter; therefore be it
- 2 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
- 3 of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania urge the Congress of the
- 4 United States to admit Washington, DC, as the 51st state of the
- 5 United States of America; and be it further
- 6 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of
- 7 Pennsylvania urge the Congress of the United States to pass H.R.
- 8 51 or other legislation that allows Washington, DC, to become
- 9 the 51st state of the United States of America; and be it
- 10 further
- 11 RESOLVED, That copies of this resolution be transmitted to
- 12 the presiding officers of each house of Congress and to each
- 13 member of Congress from Pennsylvania.
