A RESOLUTION

- Designating November 22, 2020, as "Veterans Suicide Prevention and Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania. 2
- 3 WHEREAS, On average, 22 veterans of the United States Armed
- Forces commit suicide each day; and
- WHEREAS, Of the 22 veterans who commit suicide each day, 14
- of the suicides are committed by veterans who do not seek help
- 7 from the Veterans Health Administration; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Suicide rates among veterans are higher than the
- general population, especially among women; and
- 10 WHEREAS, The majority of suicides committed by veterans are
- 11 caused by drug overdoses or poisoning; and
- 12 WHEREAS, The United States Department of Veterans Affairs and
- the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs of the 13
- Commonwealth offer programs and work with outside organizations 14

- 1 to provide mental health care to our veterans; and
- 2 WHEREAS, Each Veterans Health Administration facility has
- 3 suicide prevention coordinators onsite to support veterans in
- 4 times of crisis; and
- 5 WHEREAS, As citizens of this Commonwealth, we all need to be
- 6 more vigilant of the warning signs that a veteran may be
- 7 suicidal, including, but not limited to, feelings of
- 8 hopelessness, anxiety, agitation and mood swings; and
- 9 WHEREAS, Warning signs that require immediate attention
- 10 include any of the following:
- 11 (1) Thinking about hurting or killing oneself.
- 12 (2) Looking for ways to die.
- 13 (3) Talking about death, dying or suicide.
- 14 (4) Self-destructive or risk-taking behavior, especially
- when the behavior includes drugs, alcohol or weapons;
- 16 and
- 17 WHEREAS, Veterans, family members and care providers can
- 18 initiate a free and confidential conversation with a Veterans
- 19 Health Administration provider by calling the Veterans Crisis
- 20 Line at 1-800-273-8255; and
- 21 WHEREAS, Veterans or family members of veterans can chat
- 22 online with a Veterans Health Administration provider via the
- 23 publicly accessible Internet website
- 24 veteranscrisisline.net/chat; and
- 25 WHEREAS, Veterans or family members of veterans can send a
- 26 text message to 838255 to connect to a Veterans Health
- 27 Administration provider; and
- 28 WHEREAS, We all need to do our part to help those who served
- 29 our nation so bravely in the United States Armed Forces;
- 30 therefore be it

- 1 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate
- 2 November 22, 2020, as "Veterans Suicide Prevention and Awareness
- 3 Day" in Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 4 RESOLVED, That on November 22, 2020, we honor the memories of
- 5 our 22 fallen veterans who leave us each day.
