A RESOLUTION

1 2	Designating the month of September 2018 as "#UTILITYCAREERS Month" in Pennsylvania.
3	WHEREAS, Utility providers in this Commonwealth bring vital
4	services to our homes and businesses; and
5	WHEREAS, Utility employment represents tens of thousands of
6	community-oriented jobs with good wages, career growth and
7	training opportunities and the satisfaction of knowing that you
8	are serving your neighbors; and
9	WHEREAS, There is a strong need for additional skilled
10	utility workers across our nation and in this Commonwealth due
11	to a combination of factors, including an aging current
12	workforce and the growth of new systems and technologies; and
13	WHEREAS, Utility employment in this Commonwealth is growing
14	faster and wages are substantially higher than other employment
15	sectors; and
16	WHEREAS, The average wage for a utility worker in this

Commonwealth is just over \$93,000 per year, which is nearly twice the average wage for other employment sectors; and WHEREAS, The number of utility jobs has increased by more than 11% over the past five years in this Commonwealth, which is five times the job growth compared to other employment sectors; and

7 WHEREAS, There is a nationwide and Statewide need for all of 8 the following skilled utility personnel:

9 (1) engineers;

10 (2) field operators who maintain existing systems and 11 build-out new systems;

12 (3) plant operators who keep the energy and water13 flowing to our communities; and

14 (4) various technical experts, including cybersecurity15 experts;

WHEREAS, Nationally, utility providers are expected to hire an additional 70,000 workers by 2020 and growth in the energy sector alone is expected to create an estimated 1.5 million jobs by 2030; and

21 WHEREAS, Utility providers keep the residents of this 22 Commonwealth safe and healthy and it is important to ensure that 23 utility providers have the skilled personnel they need to meet 24 the needs of today and tomorrow; and

25 WHEREAS, It is essential for utility providers, State 26 agencies, educational institutions and other concerned parties 27 to work collaboratively to develop a skilled and diverse 28 workforce to support these essential services; therefore be it 29 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate the 30 month of September 2018 as "#UTILITYCAREERS Month" in

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Pennsylvania in recognition of the effort to increase access to
information about utility career opportunities and encourage
efforts to highlight the importance of educating the next
generation of utility workers.
