A RESOLUTION

- 1 Designating October 19, 2016, as "Lock 'Em Up Day in PA."
- 2 WHEREAS, Misuse and abuse of prescription drugs has serious
- 3 social and public health consequences; and
- 4 WHEREAS, Drug overdose is the leading cause of accidental
- 5 death nationwide; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Relatives and friends are the primary sources of
- 7 commonly abused prescription drugs; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Prescription opioid abuse is recognized as a State
- 9 and national epidemic; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Opioid medications and other prescription drugs must
- 11 always be stored securely; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Any person having prescription drugs at home is at
- 13 risk for medication diversion, the transfer of a legally
- 14 prescribed controlled substance for unlawful distribution or
- 15 use; and
- 16 WHEREAS, According to the National Survey on Drug Use and

- 1 Health, 70% of controlled substance prescription abusers obtain
- 2 their drugs from a family member or friend; and
- 3 WHEREAS, The survey further reflects that 53% of persons 12
- 4 years of age or older who used pain relievers nonmedically
- 5 during the prior year had obtained them from a family member or
- 6 friend; and
- 7 WHEREAS, A Pennsylvania Health Care Cost Containment Council
- 8 research brief using data from 2000 through 2014 shows a 225%
- 9 increase in the number of hospitalizations for overdose of pain
- 10 medication and a 162% increase in the number of hospitalizations
- 11 for overdose of heroin; and
- 12 WHEREAS, Opioid overdose caused the deaths of more than 2,500
- 13 Pennsylvanians in 2014; and
- 14 WHEREAS, Safe storage practices include locking prescription
- 15 drugs in a secure drawer or cabinet that is out of sight and out
- 16 of reach of children, visitors and other family members; and
- 17 WHEREAS, Consistently returning medication to its secure
- 18 location after each use is another important step in curbing the
- 19 State and national opioid epidemic; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Authorized take-back programs in our communities
- 21 allow consumers to promptly, safely and responsibly dispose of
- 22 most types of unused medications; therefore be it
- 23 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate October
- 24 19, 2016, as "Lock 'Em Up Day in PA" to ensure proper storage
- 25 and disposal of opioids and other prescription drugs.
