A RESOLUTION

- Designating October 27 through November 11, 2018, as "Military Appreciation Week" in Pennsylvania in coordination with The Pennsylvania State University.
- 4 WHEREAS, The Pennsylvania State University (Penn State) has a
- 5 long history of support for our military and acknowledges the
- 6 many contributions of those who have bravely served our country;
- 7 and
- 8 WHEREAS, Penn State has a longstanding and proud tradition of
- 9 serving the men and women of our military and giving back
- 10 through education, benefits and resources; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Penn State's annual Military Appreciation
- 12 celebration is an opportunity for the Penn State community to
- 13 join together to honor and publicly commend those who have
- 14 served; and
- 15 WHEREAS, It is our responsibility to do everything we can to
- 16 honor and support those who have served our nation; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Penn State has the largest Military Appreciation
- 2 celebration of its kind in the Big 10 Conference; and
- 3 WHEREAS, While Penn State regularly offers multiple programs
- 4 of support, resources and wide-ranging recognition to our
- 5 military personnel, it also dedicates two weeks in the fall to
- 6 our service men and women; and
- WHEREAS, Today, more than 5,600 Penn State students have
- 8 direct military ties as active-duty service members, reservists,
- 9 veterans or military dependents, across all of Penn State's
- 10 campuses, including Penn State World Campus; and
- 11 WHEREAS, Penn State has consistently been recognized as a
- 12 military-friendly school for the many academic programs and
- 13 support resources available to active duty, veteran and Reserve
- 14 Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) students; and
- 15 WHEREAS, For veteran students at every Penn State campus and
- 16 online through the World Campus, Penn State offers peer
- 17 counseling services and assists with VA benefits, the college
- 18 application process, financial aid and living arrangements
- 19 through the Office of Veterans Programs; and
- 20 WHEREAS, As part of its mission, Penn State has offered
- 21 training in military studies since its founding in 1855; and
- 22 WHEREAS, The GI Bill helped boost enrollments at Penn State
- 23 following World War II; and
- 24 WHEREAS, ROTC participation at Penn State was mandatory for
- 25 male students until 1962; and
- 26 WHEREAS, This year's Military Appreciation theme recognizes
- 27 100 years of women officially serving in the United States Armed
- 28 Forces since World War I; and
- 29 WHEREAS, At Penn State, women have a rich military history,
- 30 from training as aeronautical engineers during World War II to

- 1 participating in the university's ROTC beginning in 1972, when
- 2 for the first time women were permitted to join the program
- 3 nationally; and
- WHEREAS, Today, approximately 25% of Penn State's ROTC cadets
- 5 are women serving alongside male counterparts; and
- 6 WHEREAS, Military service is an integral component of Penn
- 7 State's long history; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate October
- 9 27 through November 11, 2018, as "Military Appreciation Week" in
- 10 Pennsylvania in coordination with The Pennsylvania State
- 11 University; and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize Penn
- 13 State's history of support for our nation's military and honor
- 14 those who have served in the United States Armed Forces.
