A RESOLUTION

Designating July 22, 2023, as "Hemihyperplasia Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania. 2 3 WHEREAS, Hemihyperplasia, also called hemihypertrophy, is a congenital disorder, causing overgrowth of one side of a child's 5 body in comparison with the other; and 6 WHEREAS, Hemihyperplasia may be isolated, occurring without 7 any signs or symptoms; and 8 WHEREAS, Hemihyperplasia may be a sign of another medical condition such as: 10 (1)Klippel-Trenaunay syndrome. 11 (2) Beckwith-Wiedemann syndrome. 12 (3) Proteus syndrome. 13 Neurofibromatosis Type I. (4)14 (5) Russell-Silver syndrome. 15 (6) Sotos syndrome. 16 WHEREAS, Symptoms vary depending on the child, but can 17 include difficulty eating, chewing, seeing and breathing; and

WHEREAS, Children with hemihyperplasia may have symptoms that

- 1 are difficult to diagnose; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The most common symptom is a subtle difference
- 3 between the two sides of the face and other appearance-related
- 4 concerns occurring as the disease progresses; and
- 5 WHEREAS, Treatment options include suction-assisted
- 6 lipectomy, excision of excessive skin and subcutaneous tissue
- 7 and contouring or reducing facial bones; and
- 8 WHEREAS, An orthopedic provider can provide treatment of
- 9 abnormal limb size to an individual suspected of having
- 10 hemihyperplasia; therefore be it
- 11 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate July
- 12 22, 2023, as "Hemihyperplasia Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania;
- 13 and be it further
- 14 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives raise awareness
- 15 and encourage research to fight this disease.
