1 2	Appointing and empowering the Judiciary Committee to make an investigation.
3	RESOLVED, By the House of Representatives of the Commonwealth
4	of Pennsylvania, that the Judiciary Committee be authorized to
5	investigate the conduct of Mark Reese, the sheriff of Lancaster
6	County, to determine whether Mark Reese is liable to impeachment
7	for misbehavior in office and to report to the House of
8	Representatives the conclusions of the committee in respect to
9	the investigation and determination with its appropriate
10	recommendations; and be it further
11	RESOLVED, That the Judiciary Committee designate the <
12	Subcommittee on Courts to take testimony, review documents or
13	other materials and interview witnesses for the use of the
14	Judiciary Committee. The Subcommittee on Courts is authorized
15	and empowered to make recommendations to the Judiciary Committee
16	and, in the performance of its duties:

(1) send for persons and papers and subpoena witnesses,

1 documents, and other materials under the seal of 2 subcommittee chairperson; 3 (2) administer oaths to witnesses; (3) take testimony; and 4 5 (4) prepare and file pleadings and other legal-6 documents; and be it further 7 8 RESOLVED, That, upon receipt of the recommendations of the Subcommittee on Courts, the Judiciary Committee be authorized 10 and empowered to: 11 send for persons and papers and subpoena witnesses, (1)documents and other materials under the hand and seal of the 12 13 chairperson; 14 (2) administer oaths to witnesses; 15 (3) take testimony; 16 prepare and file pleadings and other legal documents; and 17 18 employ staff FOR THE USE OF THE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE <--19 AND THE SUBCOMMITTEE ON COURTS; 20 and be it further 21 RESOLVED, THAT THE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE DESIGNATE THE <--22 SUBCOMMITTEE ON COURTS TO TAKE TESTIMONY, REVIEW DOCUMENTS OR 23 OTHER MATERIALS AND INTERVIEW WITNESSES FOR THE USE OF THE 24 JUDICIARY COMMITTEE. THE SUBCOMMITTEE ON COURTS IS AUTHORIZED 25 AND EMPOWERED TO MAKE RECOMMENDATIONS TO THE JUDICIARY COMMITTEE 26 AND, IN THE PERFORMANCE OF ITS DUTIES: 27 SEND FOR PERSONS AND PAPERS AND SUBPOENA WITNESSES, (1)DOCUMENTS AND OTHER MATERIALS UNDER THE SEAL OF THE 28 29 SUBCOMMITTEE CHAIRPERSON;

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(2) ADMINISTER OATHS TO WITNESSES;

- 4 AND BE IT FURTHER
- 5 RESOLVED, That a sergeant-at-arms or his deputy shall serve
- 6 the process of the Judiciary Committee and Subcommittee on
- 7 Courts and execute their orders. The Judiciary Committee and
- 8 Subcommittee on Courts are authorized to sit during the sessions
- 9 of this House. The expenses of the investigation shall be paid
- 10 out of an appropriate account of the Chief Clerk, except that if <--
- 11 any staff expenses or compensation are to be paid by the Chief-
- 12 Clerk, the approval of the Bipartisan Management Committee shall-
- 13 be required. BY THE CHIEF CLERK FROM APPROPRIATION ACCOUNTS <--
- 14 UNDER THE CHIEF CLERK'S EXCLUSIVE CONTROL AND JURISDICTION, UPON
- 15 A WRITTEN REQUEST APPROVED BY THE SPEAKER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 16 REPRESENTATIVES, THE MAJORITY LEADER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 17 REPRESENTATIVES OR THE MINORITY LEADER OF THE HOUSE OF
- 18 REPRESENTATIVES.
