A CONCURRENT RESOLUTION

Designating October 28, 2021, as "Lights On Afterschool Day" in Pennsylvania. 2 3 WHEREAS, The residents of this Commonwealth stand firmly committed to quality after-school programs and opportunities 5 because those programs and opportunities: provide safe, challenging and engaging learning 6 experiences that help children develop social, emotional, 7 8 physical and academic skills; support working families by ensuring that their 9 10 children are safe and productive after the regular school day 11 ends; 12 build stronger communities by involving students, 1.3 parents, business leaders and adult volunteers in the lives 14 of young people, thereby promoting positive relationships 15 among youth, families and adults; and engage families, schools and community partners in 16

advancing the welfare of our children;

- 2 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania has provided significant leadership in
- 3 the area of community involvement in the education and well-
- 4 being of our youth, grounded in the principle that quality
- 5 after-school programs are key to helping our children become
- 6 successful adults; and
- 7 WHEREAS, It is estimated that every \$1 invested in after-
- 8 school programs saves \$3 by increasing students' earning
- 9 potential, improving students' performance at school and
- 10 reducing crime and welfare costs; and
- 11 WHEREAS, For students in kindergarten through twelfth grade,
- 12 more than 89% of their time is spent learning outside school
- 13 during after-school and summer programs, in libraries, museums
- 14 and science centers or at home or in the community; and
- WHEREAS, After-school programs engage students in hands-on,
- 16 real-world science, technology, engineering and math (STEM)
- 17 projects to help build vital 21st-century skills, cultivate an
- 18 interest in STEM and offer innovative ways for students to
- 19 connect STEM to their lives and communities; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Approximately 19.4 million families report that they
- 21 would enroll their child in an after-school program if one were
- 22 available; and
- 23 WHEREAS, After-school programs can provide holistic support
- 24 for children and improve the development of social and emotional
- 25 competencies such as problem solving, critical thinking and
- 26 interpersonal skills; and
- 27 WHEREAS, Many after-school programs across the country are
- 28 facing funding shortfalls so severe that they are being forced
- 29 to close their doors and turn off their lights; and
- 30 WHEREAS, Pennsylvania is committed to investing in the health

- 1 and safety of all young people by providing expanded learning
- 2 opportunities that will help close the achievement gap and
- 3 prepare young people to compete in the global economy; and
- 4 WHEREAS, "Lights On Afterschool," the national celebration of
- 5 after-school programs held this year on October 28, 2021,
- 6 promotes the importance of quality after-school programs in the
- 7 lives of children, families and communities; therefore be it
- 8 RESOLVED (the Senate concurring), That the General Assembly
- 9 designate October 28, 2021, as "Lights On Afterschool Day" in
- 10 Pennsylvania; and be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the General Assembly enthusiastically endorse
- 12 "Lights On Afterschool" and commit this Commonwealth to engage
- 13 in innovative after-school programs and activities that ensure
- 14 that the lights stay on and the doors stay open for all children
- 15 after school.
