## A RESOLUTION

2 3 4 5 6 7	Commission on Crime and Delinquency, the Department of Human Services and the Department of Corrections to collaborate and conduct a study on the education being provided to children, dependent children and youth 6 through 21 years of age in juvenile and adult correctional facilities throughout this Commonwealth.
8	WHEREAS, Youth in the juvenile justice system need a quality
9	education so that they can develop the skills they need to
10	become successful adults; and
11	WHEREAS, Research suggests that many young people enter the
12	juvenile justice system well behind grade level; and
13	WHEREAS, Studies demonstrate that system-involved youth are
14	chronically behind in school; and
15	WHEREAS, Nationally, as many as two-thirds of youth dropped
16	out of school after release from the system; and
17	WHEREAS, United States Department of Education data shows
18	that most youth in juvenile justice facilities made no
19	meaningful progress in learning or academic achievement; and

- 1 WHEREAS, There are serious questions about quality of
- 2 curricula used in juvenile and adult correctional facilities and
- 3 whether the curricula is aligned to Pennsylvania Core Standards;
- 4 and
- 5 WHEREAS, Continuity of instruction is often compromised by
- 6 disruptions due to institutional activities and routines within
- 7 the correctional facility; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Placement in a juvenile justice facility is a
- 9 turning point for many youth and without appropriate programming
- 10 and coordination, too many youths fall behind while in custody;
- 11 and
- 12 WHEREAS, In 2012, the United States Department of Education
- 13 hosted a correctional education summit at which recommendations
- 14 were made for the Federal Government to address the quality of
- 15 education provided to children and youth in juvenile and adult
- 16 correctional facilities at the state level; and
- 17 WHEREAS, The Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA) (Public Law
- 18 114-95, 129 Stat. 1802) establishes broad goals related to
- 19 delinquent youth, including improving education services to
- 20 provide the opportunity to meet state academic standards,
- 21 improving youth transition from institutionalization to further
- 22 schooling or employment, preventing dropout of youth and
- 23 providing young people returning from correctional facilities or
- 24 institutions for neglected and delinquent children and youth
- 25 with reentry support; and
- 26 WHEREAS, Education services can take many different forms,
- 27 including alternative schools for disruptive youth or GED only
- 28 programs as there are no uniform provisions of education
- 29 services within placement facilities and programs through
- 30 intermediate units, private facilities and school districts; and

- 1 WHEREAS, The oversight and monitoring of programs varies
- 2 widely depending on type of facility and type of program;
- 3 therefore be it
- 4 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the
- 5 Department of Education, the Pennsylvania Commission on Crime
- 6 and Delinquency, the Department of Human Services and the
- 7 Department of Corrections to collaborate and conduct a study on
- 8 the education being provided to delinquent or dependent children
- 9 and youth, 6 through 21 years of age, in juvenile and adult
- 10 correctional or congregate care facilities throughout this
- 11 Commonwealth and issue a report on the study's findings; and be
- 12 it further
- RESOLVED, That the study address the quality of education
- 14 provided to delinquent or dependent children and youth,
- 15 specifically if the curricula in juvenile and adult correctional
- 16 or congregate care facilities is aligned to Pennsylvania's Core
- 17 Standards; and be it further
- 18 RESOLVED, That the study evaluate how the needs of children
- 19 and youth with an individualized education plan (IEP) or
- 20 qualified 504 plan are met while the children and youth are
- 21 placed in facilities that provide the necessary support to meet
- 22 the preplacement-identified educational needs and the role of
- 23 the original resident school district and educational guardians
- 24 in the IEP or 504 plan monitoring or IEP or 504 plan monitoring
- 25 development; and be it further
- 26 RESOLVED, That the study include an assessment on the support
- 27 and training provided to education professionals in juvenile and
- 28 adult correctional or congregate care facilities; and be it
- 29 further
- 30 RESOLVED, That the study include how Pennsylvania will comply

- 1 with or seek opportunities to exceed Federal standards for
- 2 incarcerated youth established by ESSA; and be it further
- 3 RESOLVED, That the Department of Education, the Pennsylvania
- 4 Commission on Crime and Delinquency, the Department of Human
- 5 Services and the Department of Corrections review the
- 6 recommendations of the United States Department of Education on
- 7 correctional and reentry education for children and youth 6
- 8 through 12 years of age and report on how Pennsylvania performs
- 9 in regard to the recommendations established in that report; and
- 10 be it further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the Department of Education, the Pennsylvania
- 12 Commission on Crime and Delinquency, the Department of Human
- 13 Services and the Department of Corrections provide a report to
- 14 the Education Committee of the House of Representatives and the
- 15 Judiciary Committee of the House of Representatives no later
- 16 than 18 months from the date of the adoption of this resolution.
