1 2 3 4 5 6	Directing the Joint State Government Commission to conduct a study on the development and implementation of a campaign contribution reporting system that requires contributions to be reported within 24 hours of receipt, establish an advisory committee to assist with the study and issue a report of its findings and recommendations to the House of Representatives.
7	WHEREAS, The amount of money in politics continues to
8	increase year to year and impacts campaigns and our system of
9	government; and
10	WHEREAS, The current finance disclosure process in this
11	Commonwealth creates long lags in the timely posting of campaign
12	contributions; and
13	WHEREAS, The people of this Commonwealth are entitled to
14	accurate and timely information about the individuals and
15	special interests that are funding a campaign; and
16	WHEREAS, By requiring campaign contributions to be reported
17	within 24 hours of receipt, voters will have the ability to
18	quickly determine how the contributors to a campaign impact the
19	support level for a particular candidate; and
20	WHEREAS, Requiring campaign contributions to be reported

- 1 within 24 hours of receipt will create a more informed, better
- 2 engaged electorate; therefore be it
- RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives direct the Joint
- 4 State Government Commission to conduct a study on the
- 5 development and implementation of a campaign contribution
- 6 reporting system that requires contributions to be reported
- 7 within 24 hours of receipt, establish an advisory committee to
- 8 assist with the study and issue a report of its findings and
- 9 recommendations to the House of Representatives; and be it
- 10 further
- 11 RESOLVED, That the advisory committee consist of the
- 12 following:
- 13 (1) the Secretary of the Commonwealth or a designee;
- 14 (2) one member appointed by the President pro tempore of
- 15 the Senate;
- 16 (3) one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
- 17 Senate;
- 18 (4) one member appointed by the Speaker of the House of
- 19 Representatives;
- 20 (5) one member appointed by the Minority Leader of the
- 21 House of Representatives;
- 22 (6) two residents of this Commonwealth appointed by the
- 23 Governor with subject matter expertise on campaign finance
- laws; and
- 25 (7) two residents of this Commonwealth with expertise
- that will provide assistance to the Department of State in
- developing technology allowing for the immediate uploading of
- 28 campaign contributions;
- 29 and be it further
- 30 RESOLVED, That the study by the Joint State Government

- 1 Commission, in collaboration with the advisory committee:
- 2 (1) identify the technology needed to implement a
- 3 reporting system in which campaign contributions can be
- 4 reported within 24 hours of receipt;
- 5 (2) identify best practices and rationale for the timely
- 6 reporting of campaign contributions; and
- 7 (3) include recommendations for legislative or
- 8 administrative action to implement the reporting system,
- 9 including recommendations for penalties for not reporting
- 10 campaign contributions within 24 hours of receipt;
- 11 and be it further
- 12 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission form the
- 13 advisory committee within three months of the adoption of this
- 14 resolution; and be it further
- 15 RESOLVED, That the Joint State Government Commission issue a
- 16 report of its findings and recommendations to the House of
- 17 Representatives no later than one year after the adoption of
- 18 this resolution.
