## A RESOLUTION

Designating May 5, 2015, as "Ependymoma Awareness Day" in 1 Pennsylvania. 2 3 WHEREAS, Ependymoma is a rare type of brain or spinal cord tumor that begins in the central nervous system and develops 4 5 from cells that line the ventricles in the brain or the spinal 6 cord; and 7 WHEREAS, The cause of ependymoma is unknown, but it affects 8 children at higher rates than adults; and

9 WHEREAS, According to the National Brain Tumor Society, 10 ependymoma tumors are confined to one area of the brain, can be 11 located in the ventricles of the brain or blocking them causing 12 water on the brain and may extend to the spinal cord; and 13 WHEREAS, The National Cancer Institute at the National 14 Institutes of Health reports that about 1 in 11 childhood brain 15 tumors are ependymomas; and 1 WHEREAS, Ninety percent of ependymomas in children occur in 2 the brain, while more than 60% of ependymomas present in adults 3 occur in the spinal cord, with men suffering from this condition 4 at a higher rate than women; and

5 WHEREAS, Children who suffer from ependymoma experience the 6 following symptoms: frequent headaches, seizures, nausea and 7 vomiting and a loss of balance or trouble walking; and 8 WHEREAS, Adults who have ependymoma exhibit the following 9 symptoms: back pain, weakness in the arms or legs, numbness or 10 tingling in the arms or legs and problems controlling bowel or 11 bladder functions; and

12 WHEREAS, Surgery and radiation therapy are common treatments 13 for ependymoma; and

14 WHEREAS, The first "Ependymoma Awareness Day" was 15 commemorated by releasing butterflies during the Collaborative 16 Ependymoma Research Network (CERN) Foundation investor meeting 17 held on April 19, 2012, as the butterflies are symbolic of hope 18 through change; and

WHEREAS, CERN was established in November 2006, when Mark Gilbert, M.D., Deputy Chairman of Neuro-Oncology at the University of Texas MD Anderson Cancer Center, developed the idea of creating an international group to develop new treatments for ependymoma; and

24 WHEREAS, The CERN Foundation focuses on five main projects, 25 including clinical trials, tumor profiling and pathology, 26 development of therapeutics, tumor stem cell and laboratory 27 models and patient outcomes; therefore be it

RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives designate May 5, 29 2015, as "Ependymoma Awareness Day" in Pennsylvania to raise 30 awareness of the disease, while urging support for patients,
