- Recognizing the month of January 2017 as "National Mentoring Month" in Pennsylvania.
- 3 WHEREAS, Mentoring is a proven youth development strategy
- 4 that matches children and young adults with a caring,
- 5 responsible adult who can provide quidance and direction and
- 6 build trust; and
- 7 WHEREAS, The Mentoring Partnership & Resource Center and the
- 8 Mentoring Partnership of Southwestern Pennsylvania have earned
- 9 recognition for promoting mentoring opportunities in this
- 10 Commonwealth; and
- 11 WHEREAS, These organizations provide resources, training and
- 12 technical assistance necessary for public, private and nonprofit
- 13 mentoring-focused organizations to administer effective, high-
- 14 quality practices for the benefit of children and youths in our
- 15 communities; and

- 1 WHEREAS, Mentors are friends, role models, teachers and
- 2 sources of stability and support during a critical time in a
- 3 child's life, encouraging character development, promoting
- 4 successful educational and career outcomes, boosting confidence,
- 5 lifting expectations and inspiring young people to do their
- 6 best; and
- 7 WHEREAS, Research has shown the beneficial long-term effects
- 8 of mentoring in increasing academic engagement and decreasing
- 9 the likelihood of substance abuse and other risky behaviors; and
- 10 WHEREAS, Mentoring further strengthens the economic and
- 11 social well-being of this Commonwealth by enabling young people
- 12 to fulfill their potential while pursuing healthy family
- 13 relationships and active community involvement; and
- 14 WHEREAS, With the support of many private and public sector
- 15 organizations that participate in mentoring, residents of this
- 16 Commonwealth are making a profound difference in the lives of
- 17 young people every day through their service as mentors; and
- 18 WHEREAS, Thousands of children in this Commonwealth need a
- 19 caring adult mentor in their lives; and
- 20 WHEREAS, Closing the existing mentoring gap requires more
- 21 investment, partnerships and volunteers who are ready to make a
- 22 difference in a child's life; and
- 23 WHEREAS, "National Mentoring Month" is an opportunity to
- 24 raise public awareness of the importance of mentoring,
- 25 acknowledge the dedicated individuals who serve as mentors and
- 26 encourage wider involvement in building a brighter future for
- 27 children and youths through mentoring; therefore be it
