A RESOLUTION

- 1 Recognizing April 16, 2015, as "Holocaust Remembrance Day" in
- 2 Pennsylvania in commemoration of the millions of innocent
- 3 victims of Nazi atrocities.
- 4 WHEREAS, The Holocaust was the state-sponsored, systematic
- 5 persecution and annihilation of the European Jewry by Nazi
- 6 Germany and its collaborators between 1933 and 1945, during
- 7 which time six million Jews were murdered; and
- 8 WHEREAS, Roma (Gypsies), people with disabilities and Poles
- 9 were also targeted for destruction or decimation for racial,
- 10 ethnic or national reasons, and millions more, including
- 11 homosexuals, Jehovah's Witnesses, Soviet prisoners of war and
- 12 political dissidents, also suffered grievous oppression and

- 1 death under Nazi tyranny; and
- 2 WHEREAS, The history of the Holocaust offers an opportunity
- 3 to reflect on the moral responsibilities of individuals,
- 4 societies and governments; and
- 5 WHEREAS, The residents of this Commonwealth should always
- 6 remember the terrible events of the Holocaust and remain
- 7 vigilant against hatred, persecution and tyranny; and
- 8 WHEREAS, The residents of this Commonwealth should actively
- 9 rededicate themselves to the principles of individual freedom in
- 10 a just society; and
- 11 WHEREAS, "Holocaust Remembrance Day" has been set aside for
- 12 the residents of this Commonwealth to remember the victims of
- 13 the Holocaust as well as to reflect on the need for respect of
- 14 all peoples; and
- WHEREAS, Pursuant to Public Law 96-388, the United States
- 16 Holocaust Memorial Council designates the Day of Remembrance
- 17 known as Yom Hashoah to be April 16, 2015; therefore be it
- 18 RESOLVED, That the House of Representatives recognize April
- 19 16, 2015, as "Holocaust Remembrance Day" in Pennsylvania in
- 20 commemoration of the millions of innocent victims of Nazi
- 21 atrocities.
